Sanitation Issues

- 50% of population, 2 billion people, across Asia and Pacific w/o access to improved sanitation
- \$8 billion annually needed to meet MDG targets for safe drinking water and sanitation
- World Panel on Financing Water Infrastructure recommended to double investments
- Need for integrated solutions (investment, reform, capacity development, governance)
- Major need for action

Water Financing Program

- March 2006 ADB commitment to double water financing in period 2006 – 2010
- Key areas – urban, rural, basin
- Actions – infrastructure, reform, capacity development
- Participation of private sector and civil society
- Innovative financing modalities

Water Financing Partnership Facility

- To support implementation of WFP
- Pooled support from financing partners
- Project support - technical assistance and investment
- Program quality support - capacity and innovation, civil society, regional cooperation
- **20% of funds for sanitation projects**
- Close collaboration with development partners

Integrated Approach

- Enabling environment of policy, legislation, regulation
- Resolve accountabilities, overlapping mandates and jurisdictions
- Address social and economic aspects
- User demand creation, social marketing
- Cost of 'no action' is higher
- Promote behavior change

Integrated Approach

- Develop sanitation strategies
- Create viable investment proposals
- Address affordability and willingness to pay
- Provide technological options, practical, affordable
- Phased development approach
- Partnering w/ other organizations

Metropolitan Sanitation Management and Health

- Indonesia - Makassar, Medan, Yogyakarta
- Improve wastewater collection and treatment, solid waste management, drainage
- Demand driven, consultative, central and local level
- City sanitation working groups
- City Sanitation Strategies

Metropolitan Sanitation Management and Health

- Develop investment program for each city
- Flexible approach to technical solutions
- Sewer system, community based solutions, revolving fund for connections
- Capacity development
- Community mobilization, empowerment, and awareness

Metropolitan Sanitation Management and Health

- Close collaboration with development partners
- Sector reform, capacity development
- USAID (ESP), WSP (ISSDP), UN-Habitat
- Increase coverage through follow up Multitranche Financing Facility – MSMHP II
