- The features that made the workshop effective included the capacity of the presenters, the use of computer aided presentations, the openness of the discussion forums (plenary sessions), the good accommodation, a good choice of topics, and good organization.

- Features that limited effectiveness included limitations on the time available for presentation of participants' own cases, the uneven capacity in the use of English and the lack of a field visit.
- Advice for future workshops included providing more time for participants to present their own experience, more uniform selection of people with current responsibility for policy work, and keeping policy and practice groups in separate workshops.
- Things participants will definitely do as a result of the workshop included the submission of recommendations on functional and institutional matters, preparation of documentation along the lines discussed, conduct of "echo" seminars, and sharing of reading materials with colleagues, staff, and managers.
- Other comments were made concerning the helpful and professional quality of the ADB/World Bank staff, the way the workshop had helped a technician to appreciate the human side of his/her work, and the desirability of conducting follow-up seminars in individual countries.

- The features that made the workshop effective included the relevance of the subject matter, the capacity of the presenters, the use of good materials, and the practicality of the approach.
- Features that limited effectiveness included limitations on the time available for presentation of participants' own cases, the need for more reading time, the use of examples from large countries of Asia, the length of the sessions and the few opportunities for small group discussion.
- Advice for future workshops included providing more time for participants to present their own experience, extending the concept of the workshop to others in the region, and earlier provision of allowances.
- Things participants will definitely do as a result of the workshop included the submission of recommendations on functional and institutional matters, preparation of documentation along the lines discussed, and conduct of "echo" workshops.
- Other comments were made concerning the helpful and professional quality of the support staff, and the desirability of conducting follow-up seminars in individual countries.
