The Knowledge Enterprise in Health (KEH) was introduced as a framework of mechanisms and systems of knowledge acquisition, creation, dissemination, application and improvement. The KEH landscaping effort will:

- i. collect data for a baseline that documents each country's knowledge enterprise;
- ii. record the opinions of key informants about the main gaps and priorities in their knowledge enterprise;
- iii. raise awareness of the role of knowledge processes in the health sector and thus build the capacity of participants, both national and WHO staff; and
- iv. gradually establish a resource network of persons involved in KM at the country level.
