



Arbind Modi is the Joint Secretary for tax policy and legislation at the Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance of India. He also served as officer on special duty to advisor to the Finance Minister and as Commissioner of Income Tax. He has extensive senior-level experience in analyzing and formulating tax policy, drafting tax legislation designing and computerizing tax administration and enforcement of tax laws.

An M.A. in Economics from Delhi University, Mr. Modi is also a Master in Public Administration (with specialisation in Economics) from the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University. He has also done a diploma in International Tax Program from Harvard Law School. As a career tax administrator, he has had a rigorous training in Direct Tax laws and a rich experience of tax administration in various capacities.

He has made invaluable contributions to the Direct Tax firmament in India through his association with almost all the Expert Committees and Task Forces on Direct Taxes that have been set-up in the last two decades. Significant among these are his contribution towards the Report on the implementation of the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management Act, 2003; the Report on Direct Tax reform (popularly known as the Kelkar Committee Report); the Tax Reforms Committee headed by Dr. Raja Chelliah; and the Advisory Group on Tax Policy and Tax Administration headed by Dr. Parthasarathi Shome.
