The TA addressed this issue in different ways:

- Training
- Communications
- Peer educators on the worksites
- Female condoms
- Health services.

# Lessons Learned

- Technically competent organization (advising vs. implementation)
- Plan and allocate funding for M&E
- There is a need for an integrated package of interventions

# Recommendations

- Integrating HIV/AIDS into infrastructure workplace practices
- To strengthen sustainability: local govt (capacity development) and companies (contracting)
- Cost of activities should be integrated in the infrastructure project costs
- Clarifying the role of the Department of Communication and local government
