This law is a spirit of IWRM




- **Basic principles of Water Resources Law, comprises of 3 pillars which are implemented comprehensively :**

- Control of Destructive Force of Water

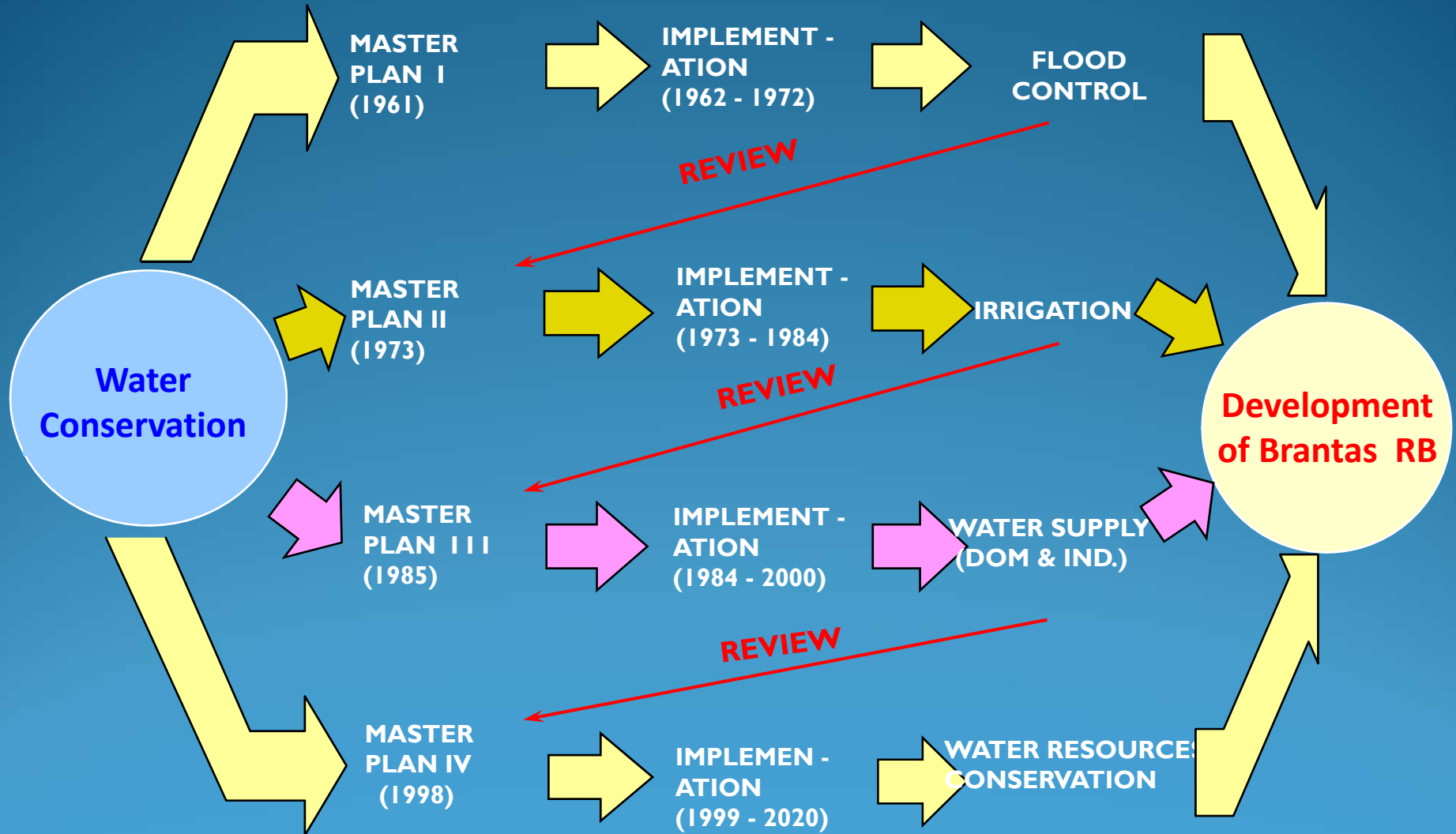


