Glossary

Land-loss farmers—According to the People’s Republic of China’s laws and regulations, land acquisition refers to turning the collective ownership of land into State ownership, excluding demolishing and reconstruction in cities. Therefore, in Chinese laws and regulations, “involuntary resettlement” is referred to by the phrase “land loss farmers,” and so for convenience of expression, the latter phrase is used throughout this report. In some instances, the term “land-taken farmers” is also used.
