

**DATABASE OF NGOS WITH ADB POTENTIALS**

1. Eligibility Criteria for Incorporating NGOs for the Database

Active, important, and effective NGOs have been termed as NGOs with 'Potential'. The database, therefore, has envisaged NGOs that have some or all of the following criteria:

- Self-driven, to a large extent
- Open base and democratic structure
- Good relations with the community, and experience of working with community, government, donors, and private sector.
- Operational program
- Reliable human resource and a strong voluntary base
- Recognition, at least at the district level, and preferably those at the National level
- Strong, committed and dedicated leadership
- Ongoing projects/program at least at the district level and preferably at the national level
- Good track record
- Sustainable program
- Accountable and transparent
- Good reputation, at both national and international level.

In preparing the NGO database most of these attributes have been taken into consideration. There are far more active, effective, and important NGOs in Nepal, which should have been incorporated here in the database. However, only those NGOs meeting the above attributes have been included and proposed as potential NGOs to work with ADB. Therefore, intentionally, only those NGOs working in ADB-assisted sectors and sectors of preference to ADB, have been encompassed.

## 2. NGO Database

### 1.1 Friends Service Council – Nepal (FSC-N)

Sector: FSC has been established through the initiatives of socially committed and dedicated people of different walks of life and different regions of the country that have long experiences in the social field. The programs are in the field of socioeconomic development and HRD with special focus upon poverty alleviation, health and sanitation, awareness raising, savings and credits and civil education. It has managed to deliver over 150 community toilet at Lubhu (Lalitpur) out of which 43% are constructed through the mobilization of local resources and participation while the rest i.e. 57% has been supported by FYS.

Activities: FSC constructed over 250 meters of sewers and maintained old sewers in the vicinity. It cleaned the lanes of Lubhu, and paved the entire area with whole -bricks. The filthiest area, was converted into clean and environmentally friendly area, where one of the major programs of Visit Nepal Year (VNY) 1998 was organized. It is in a process of establishing a trade school through the contribution of up to 50% from the local community and 50% to be borne by FSC. It also institutionalized Saving and Credit to sustain it programs.

Potentials: The institution is led by strong and committed leader, who is supported by a large base of professional volunteers. It has an operational networks and program in several districts. An American INGO 'We The People', has presented a Letter of Appreciation to FYS for its outstanding and valuable work on peace making initiative. It is also a member of 'International Society of City and Regional Planners' of Netherlands

and 'International Union of Local Authorities' (IULA) from Netherlands. It works in ADB's preferred sectors and areas and possesses the capacity to deliver services in these sectors effectively.

## 1.2 Save the Environment Foundation (SEF)

Sectors: Environment in the early 1990's was not being looked upon with great deal of concern and very few NGOs took up this sector with interest. A group of women decided to take up the challenge and formed SEF. It had been established as a self-financed NGO run by women, where most of the programs costs are borne by SEF and sponsors.

Activities: Rather than directly discouraging the polluters, SEF decided to present an award 'Best Industry Award For Environment Concern' to the industries, which had managed to maintain the environment issues seriously. All necessary requirements for selection such as pollution system and its efficiency, regular monitoring of data, housekeeping management, waste recycling, safety measures, and environmental activities were developed in advance.

It brought its 'greening campaign' to the core urban pockets of Kathmandu and began converting the filthy roadside basin into green parks. The movement has been carried out in most parts of Kathmandu and it has also been spread to other municipalities of the country as well.

Potentials: It has emerged as a sustainable NGO, which is a rare quality. It is one of the first NGOs to successfully mobilize and brought the concept of 'corporate partnership' into full motion. It could be useful for ADB-assisted projects, especially, where 'Environment Impact Assessment' are to be conducted, and where 'social motivation' is required. It has committed and dedicated professional volunteers.

## 1.3 Samaj Sudhar Club (SSC)

Sectors: It was established as a community development organization in 1977. It has managed to initiate the targeted program with the same spirit and vigour even today.

Activities: It has contributed extensively in the drinking water sector, where it provided services in ward numbers 1, 2, 3, and 8 of Shangla VDC, which is surrounded by Kavre VDC in the west, Jho, Chandeswari, Saraswati VDC in the east, Phutang VDC in the South and Nuwakot district in the north. It is one of the few NGOs to construct rural roads. The 10-km Gongabu-Tokha-Chandanbar to Sangla road, was undertaken SSC initiative with massive local resource mobilization. It has constructed two bridges of 35 tons capacity in the course of the rural road construction. SSC has delivered hardware and software in the education sector and is still operating several schools ranging from primary to higher secondary. It has been irrigating over 5 hectares at Kavresthali, Futung and Jhore for over 15,000 beneficiaries. It operates several IGP projects, ranging from dairy based program to operating rice mills, and handloom for sustainability.

Potential: It has the required level of expertise in ADB based sectors like irrigation, rural road construction, and drinking water. It provides excellent example of mobilization of domestic resources for such project. It is led by a dedicated president, who has received three decorations and several medals for his services in the sector that SSC works on. It also has networking in several other districts.

#### 1.4 Nari Bikas Sangh (NBS)

Sectors: NBS is one of the oldest and largest women based NGOs in Nepal. It was established in 1984 and has its major activities concentrated in Morang and Illam district. In the early 80's NGOs were not encouraged to undertake IGP. NGO being a nonprofit

organization income generation was considered to be less prioritized sector those days. NBS during those days took up the challenge and diverted its energy in sericulture project. In the fiscal year sericulture farmers being supported by them produced cocoons worth about Rs.1.3 million, which was considered to be far higher than the earnings derived by the government from its sericulture project.

Activities: It has been operating Family Welfare Project (FWP), whereby it goes from door to door delivering health services through its health workers and 65 volunteers. It has been undertaking drinking water projects in different VDCs, and has helped in forming users groups. These users group are provided with plumber training for repair and maintenance of the drinking water projects. It has formed 85 savings groups with a membership of 1,500 women in five VDCs and Illam municipality. It operates day care centres and has established hostels for the girls.

Potential: It has a strong and committed leader and is supported by a large group of professional volunteers. It has managed to deliver the service well, which has enabled it to command respect in the districts and area of operation. The district level and local level government is willing to extend their support and participate jointly with them. This is a positive signal for the NGOs. ADB could cash on their professional strength and on its ability to advocate, convince, and mobilize local resources. It can be considered to be a reliable organization to work with.

## Sushma Koirala Memorial Trust (SKMT)

Sectors: SKMT was established in 1993. It focuses on providing help to the downtrodden, oppressed, destitute and underprivileged people of Nepal. Its major sectors of operations are poverty alleviation and socioeconomic development, women's development, income generation, environment and sanitation.

Activities: Since its establishment it has implemented numerous national, district and local level activities and projects, to achieve its social service commitment to the poor

and disadvantaged. Under its Community Development for Rural Women Program, it has launched a large-scale pilot project in some of the VDC's of Sunsari District. It has promoted several environmental sanitation activities such as building public toilets, health centres in the slums and city areas, and setting up biogas plants. It has established Sushma Koirala Asian Institute of Polytechnic (SKAIP) to provide quality technical education to produce low and middle level technicians. It has also established Sushma Koirala Memorial Nursing Camp (SKMNC). It also hosted the Asia-Pacific Women Entrepreneurs Conference on Role of Women Entrepreneurs in New Millennium and Exhibition. The conference tried to bring women entrepreneurs together in a close networking, coordination, and cooperation.

Potentials: It is being led under a strong and able leadership, which can mobilize large volume of volunteers as and when, required. Unlike most of the NGOs, it has managed to deliver goods to the community through establishments like SKAIP and SKMNC. This institution which has strong national network can be looked upon as an asset from ADB's perspective for social mobilization at the macro level, especially, in mega projects like Melamchi.

Sectors: In 1992 a workshop comprising over 40 responsible NGOs deliberated over what their needs were. The felt needs of the NGOs in general were assessed to be capacity building; linkage establishing skill, which is lacking amongst Nepali NGOs; and information pool. Samuhik Abhiyan organizes Volunteers Program, which is divided into Professional Services (PS) and Core Program (CP). PS is used as resource window to generate funds for the CP.

Activities: It has, so far, trained and dispatched two batches of volunteers comprising of 10 and 14 respectively, and is in the process of dispatching the third batch comprising of

20. The eligibility criteria is a graduate degree and no previous experience. The volunteers are rigorously trained for 60 days on resource generation, NGO management, animation and facilitation. After the training, as per the request from the host NGO, these volunteers are dispatched to the field for 18 months. After the completion of 18 months, incentive money comprising of a package of Rs.25, 000 is awarded to each volunteer to initiate their own enterprises. It has also translated international documents in local language and disseminated amongst NGOs. The most demanded document, which it has reproduced, is 'NGO Management Manual'. Two thousand copies of this manual have already been sold.

Potential: There are very limited NGOs like this delivering capacity building services. Its program has helped build the capacity of the people from community, individuals who are trained as volunteers, and host NGOs/VDCs. Those who decided to go back to their districts e.g. in Baglung and Surkhet, have been employed as Resource Person instrumental in developing strategies and establishing linkages. It could be used in ADB-assisted projects. ADB could even look into the possibility of developing linkages with DDCs, VDCs through organizations like this. They could even serve as information pool and resource base for ADB-assisted projects.

Sectors: It has been working for ten years in different villages of Nepal with the objective of the socio-economic development of disadvantaged people, especially, women. Although it has been conducting integrated community based development programs, it is currently changing its focus to focusing on women's informal savings and credit cooperatives and sustainable agricultural programs.

- Activities: It has reached a population of over 100,000 in two districts of Nepal – Kavre and Chitwan. It is developing programs in Sindhupalanchok and Kathmandu as well. It organizes sustainable agriculture training and establishes model farmers in communities to serve as a future resource. It has 16 savings and credit women's cooperatives in its project area, ranging from 200 to 350 shareholders, which mobilizes over Rs.10 million.

Potential: WACN has an experienced and dedicated leadership. It has managed to develop a sustainable agricultural development which provided farmers, training, farmer led experimentation and extension, market study of vegetable and dairy production, model farming and multipurpose nurseries, compost and organic pest management, fodder seed plantation, and excursions and field visits etc. ADB could confidently share their experience in such related sectors.

Sectors: HLF's main objective is to improve the quality of life of the remote population of the Himalayan region via the introduction and use of environmentally friendly renewable energy technologies.

Activities: It designs and implements programs that strategically combine energy with important social concerns such as education, income generation, employment and social empowerment to encourage participation in renewable energy research and development. It aims to establish renewable energy extension centres in rural areas. Through the Solar Sisters Program it provides facilitation to the rural communities by installing solar electric systems in remote community owned buildings, which are used for women's education and local development at a highly subsidized manner. It implements Home Employment and Lighting Package that has benefitted 106 families so far. It was the pioneer in starting 4-wheeler electric vehicle in Kathmandu and has designed and begun a new Electric Vehicles passenger bus project.

Potential: It is one of the leading NGOs specializing in renewable energy sector. It has the technological know-how and the professionalism to undertake the challenges in this sector. It has extended its program in remote districts like Baglung, Dhading, Solukhumbu, Kavre, and Palpa. It could be highly instrumental in delivering environment friendly technologies both to the urban and remote areas of the country, which seem to be a sector of interest to ADB. This NGO provides a successful module of corporate partnership, which has included the private sector, NGOs, INGOs and the Government.

## 1.8 Gopal Charity Trust (GCT)

Sectors: Its basic thrust is on poverty alleviation.

Activities: It has launched a massive drive to raise domestic resources starting from amongst the members. It has managed to procure land in Rajbiraj where it has constructed a building with 14 rooms, where it is operating an offset press. It has procured land in Biratnagar, which is being used as commercial complex whose earning helps in sustaining their programs. It has procured land in Maharajgunj in Kapilbastu, where it conducts herbal training and has set up herbal processing plant. It has also worked extensively in agricultural sector, where it has been supporting the farmers to get an access to soil test, and agri-extension services. It is focusing on herbal mining program in the district.

Potential: It has set an exemplary illustration of how an NGO should explore the opportunities within, before it looks for external support. It has managed to expand its activities, especially, the herbal mining to such an extent that it is in the process of registering GCT as Multipurpose Company under the Company Act by allocating 55% share to the organization and 45% to general shareholders. GCT is to have Rs.500 million as authorized capital and Rs.20 million as issued capital. Such NGOs could be looked upon as an interesting case study by ADB. They have networking and offices in 12 districts and have 42 central staffs and 238 field workers.

Sector: It initiated its activities in late 1970s as a grassroots level NGO and now it has developed into a professional NGO. It has taken leadership in the NGO community in promoting the self-help process at the community level. Its strength is savings and credit. VYCCU, which has been developed by it, is probably the largest community based saving co-operative with 3000 members and has mobilized over Rs.40 million.

Activities: They have extended loan for livestock development in forms of IGP. It is estimated that it has been sending at least 10,000 liters of milk daily to Kathmandu. Gaidakote, where it is stationed has been declared as a Learning Center through the establishment of cooperative schools, the first of its kind in the country. It is in the process of setting up a cooperative community radio.

Potential: It has membership strength of 90 and has managed to develop networks in 7 districts of the country. It has strongly intervened in the poverty alleviation through their IGP and savings and credit program successfully, which can be taken as good examples by ADB for extending its social programs.
