## Shareholding and Voting Power

The United States is one of the two largest shareholders in ADB; the other is Japan.

Number of shares held: 552,210 (15.89 percent of total shares)

Votes: 566,933 (13.05 percent of total membership, 37.85 percent of total nonregional membership)

Overall capital subscription: US\$7.19 billion

Paid-in capital subscription: US\$503.86 million

## Contributions to Special Funds Resources

The United States has contributed to the Asian Development Fund (ADF), which is ADB's window for concessional lending to its borrowing members.

Pledged: US\$2.92 billion

Amount paid: US\$2.72 billion

## Share in ADB's Procurement Contracts

Each year, ADB provides loans to fund projects and activities in its Asian and Pacific developing members and several billion US dollars' worth of contracts to procure goods, works, and consulting services. From ADB's inception in 1966 through 2000, US firms have been awarded US\$4.8 billion in total procurement.

## Cofinancing and Export Credits

ADB arranges cofinancing from official, commercial, and export credit sources as additional resources for project financing. Cofinancing arrangements in 2000 amounted to US\$3.0 billion for 41 loan projects and US\$40.2 million in untied grant financing for 23 technical assistance projects. At the end of 2000, cumulative cofinancing arrangements (beginning in 1970) amounted to US\$35.0 billion for 557 loan projects and US\$348.0 million for 394 technical assistance grants.

Cofinancing with the United States—U.S. Trade and Development Agency, U.S. Agency for International Development, U.S. Department of the Interior, The Nature Conservancy, and commercial banks—from 1 January 1996 to 31 December 2000 comprised the following.
