DESCRIPTION

The FTESD will be available to private TESD institutions nationwide. Based on a preliminary survey among the private institutions a total of 158 private schools have indicated interest in borrowing from the FTESD with loan amount ranging from \$25,000 to \$1.25 million. The majority want to borrow from \$75,000 to \$250,000. It is expected that approximately 120 private schools will benefit from the FTESD. (Piggybacked to this loan is Strengthening Management Capacity and Improving Quality of TESD technical assistance.)

## PROJECT RATIONALE AND LINKAGE TO COUNTRY/REGIONAL STRATEGY

In its Medium-Term Philippines Development Plan, the Government emphasizes "economic growth with social equity" and a significant role of the private sector in "enhancing industrial competitiveness" in the global economy. These policy thrusts call for the development of highly skilled workforce that could compete in the international markets. To meet these requirements, the technical education and skills development system, which is the main provider of technicians and skilled workers, must be responsive to rapidly changing technology and demand of industry. TESD programs must be flexible, industry-oriented, and demand-driven. The present TESD system with its supply-driven orientation, outdated curricula, poor facilities, and inadequate teaching equipment cannot effectively produce the skilled workforce required by the economy. To promote "social equity" requires that the poor have wider access to services including better opportunities for skills training and employment with necessary support. ADB's intervention through the Project will help upgrade the quality and relevance of TESD programs in both the public and private sectors, provide financial support through loans and scholarships to the poor to enable them to acquire employable skills, and assist them in finding employment. The Project will assist the Government in strengthening the management capacity of the TESD system. The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), the main regulatory body for the TESD subsector, will be strengthened with the objective of divesting itself as the provider of training and to grow in its function more effectively as an oversight agency.
