### I. CONSISTENCY OF THE BUSINESS PLAN WITH THE PACIFIC APPROACH

- 1. The Asian Development Bank's (ADB) regional assistance in the Pacific is guided by the principles in the Pacific Approach, 2010–2014, which was extended under the Interim Pacific Approach, 2015. A new Pacific approach for 2016–2020 is being prepared. The implementation review of the Pacific Approach, 2010–2014 highlighted three strategic directions to guide ADB's work in the Pacific. ADB's interventions should help to (i) reduce the high cost of doing business and providing services in the Pacific by improving connectivity, lowering energy costs, and creating a more conducive business environment; (ii) develop country capacity to manage risks from economic shocks, natural disasters, and climate change by promoting sound public sector management and increasing resilience to climate change and natural hazards; and (iii) promote the creation of high value-added goods and services that can be competitive despite the inherent disadvantages facing the Pacific. ADB's regional assistance in the Pacific addresses these strategic directions.
- 2. Regional assistance in the Pacific includes interventions with clear regional cooperation and integration outcomes that promote regional connectivity or regional public goods, as well as activities that are common across countries and are processed together for administrative ease and cost effectiveness. Given the geography in the Pacific, some regional connectivity work, such as information communication and technology (ICT) and ports, is conducted through individual country programs, while assistance that supports regional public goods (University of South Pacific, audit, Pacific Aviation Safety Office) is included in the regional operations business plan. These activities include several flagship regional technical assistance (TA) projects—the Private Sector Development Initiative, the Pacific Economic Management, the Pacific Region Infrastructure Facility, and the Pacific Business Investment Facility.<sup>3</sup>
- 3. ADB's regional assistance in the Pacific continues ongoing assistance, while also evolving to respond to the region's needs. In 2014, Pacific leaders endorsed the Pacific Island Forum's Framework for Pacific Regionalism to allow for greater political guidance and a clear prioritization process for regional activities. The framework established a process for identifying and implementing regional priorities. At the 2015 meeting of the Pacific Islands Forum Leaders, leaders pledged a renewed commitment to accelerate the Pacific regional integration and cooperation agenda, with a focus on several key areas including climate change, fisheries, and ICT delivery. In some cases, ADB's work is already aligned with these priorities. The ongoing ICT TA project will be expanded to provide additional technical support for feasibility assessments and project preparation, and to facilitate sector assessment and planning. ADB will conduct knowledge work to determine how support can be designed to assist Pacific

developing member countries (DMCs) increase revenues from fisheries while maintaining their sustainability. The updated results framework is in Appendix 1 and the list of linked documents is in Appendix 2.

#### II. INDICATIVE RESOURCE PARAMETERS

- 4. **Lending program.** The regional program is currently expected to total \$91.40 million during 2016–2018 (Appendix 3, Table A3.1). Cofinancing and funding from other sources, including the Asian Development Fund's subregional pool, will be actively explored in consultation with the governments.
- 5. **Nonlending program.** Regional TA is expected to total \$19.34 million during 2016–2018, with at least 20% from cofinancing (Appendix 3, Table A3.2). The nonlending program emphasizes building linkages to facilitate heightened economic growth. It also focuses on efficiency gains to be achieved through joint regional approaches to issues in key sectors. Support will be continued through ongoing flagship TA projects (para. 2).
- 6. To minimize capacity demands on governments, ADB will seek to collaborate with other development partners in implementing the lending and nonlending program, and will seek cofinancing to bring additional resources to the Pacific. ADB's Trade Finance Program has expanded into the Pacific, and will be active during 2016–2018.

#### III. SUMMARY OF CHANGES TO LENDING AND NONLENDING PROGRAMS

- 7. The key adjustments to the lending and TA program include the following (Appendix 3, Table A3.1 and A3.2).
  - (i) Combination of multitranche financing facility tranches. Higher Education in the Pacific Investment Program Tranches 2 and 3 will be combined to streamline implementation.
  - (ii) One project and three TAs moved. Higher Education in the Pacific Investment Project (2017 to 2018), Pacific Economic Management, Phase 2 (additional financing) (2015 to 2017), Evolving Linkages of the Pacific Economies, Phase 2 (2016 to 2017), and Preparing the Higher Education in the Pacific Investment Project (2016 to 2017).
  - (iii) **Four projects added**. Improving Quality Basic Education in the North Pacific, Contingent Credit for Natural Disasters, e-Pacific: Regional Project for ICT Development in the Pacific, and Subregional Agribusiness Support Project;
  - (iv) Seven TAs added. e-Pacific: Regional Program for ICT Development in the Pacific; Small and Medium Enterprise Finance in Pacific DMCs; Trade Linkages and Transport Facilitation in the Pacific (Phase 2); Building Project Implementation Capacity; Preparing the Improving Quality of Basic Education Project; Information and Communication Technology; and Establishment of the Pacific Region Infrastructure Facility Coordination Office, Phase 2 (additional financing).
