SOCIAL SAFEGUARD DUE DILIGENCE

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1. India and State of Uttarakhand envision a reduction in poverty and an increase in personal incomes by improving personal mobility and accessibility through increased investment in road infrastructure. The National Highways Development Program (NHDP) and the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojna (PMGSY) Program are important features of the India's economic development and poverty reduction strategy. Uttarakhand has prepared a Road Development Plan (RDP) to guide its investment in roads. Investments under the RDP include seven sequential projects to be implemented under the Uttarakhand State Road Investment Program between 2007 and 2017. For this purpose, a Framework Financing Agreement (FFA) was signed between Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Government of India (GoI) on 14 November 2006 with regard to Uttarakhand State Road Investment Program (USRIP). Subsequently on 18 December 2006, the Board approved the provisions of loans under a Multitranche Financing Facility (MFF) in an aggregate amount up to \$550 million to India for the investment program to finance part of the RDP. The loan amounting to \$150.00 million for project III was negotiated on 24 December 2013 by the GoI and ADB and made effective on 28th January, 2014 by ADB.
- 2. USRIP, Project III is composed of 89 roads with a total length of 1036 km. Out of the 89 roads, 5 were found to have social impacts due to strengthening of roads and accordingly 5 Resettlement plans (RP) have been prepared to guide the PWD in compensating and assisting the loss of affected persons (AP). The compliances of social safeguards and satisfactory implementation of the above mentioned 5 RPs will facilitate the loan release for project III and for the preparation of 4th tranche for Project IV. A total investment of \$173.267 million was earmarked for Project III, with \$150 million to be financed by loan from ADB.
- 3. This report is the outcome of due diligence of resettlement plan implementation carried out by the NGO in close association with PMU/PMC as part of the loan agreement.

2. APPRECIATION OF SUB-PROJECT

4. The scope of infrastructure improvement component in Project III includes the strengthening and reconstruction of the selected sections of state highways, major district roads, and other district roads. The right-of-ways (ROWs) vary as there are roads that shall be widened to 5m or 7m for carriageways, but the existing 3.5 m single-lane carriageways will be retained. However, the ROWs are not clear on the dimensions of the roads shoulders and the zone of safety. Details of 5 roads having resettlement impact are given in Table 1.

2.1 Resettlement Policy Framework

- 5. Resettlement Framework: As part of USRIP, Government of Uttarakhand has formulated a Resettlement Framework in compliance with the ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement, 2009, which shall apply to all sub-projects under the loan with an aim to ensure that persons affected by land acquisition and/or involuntary resettlement are provided with appropriate compensation and rehabilitation assistance. The RF stipulates for compensation and assistance to all eligible APs irrespective of their customary rights of occupancy/titles and includes those who (i) lose/reduce land, (ii) source of income is adversely affected, (iii) houses partially/fully demolished, (iv) other properties such as crops, trees, and other assets or access to these properties are reduced or damaged due to the project. A copy of Entitlement Matrix which is part of the Resettlement Framework is given in Annexure-1.
- Compensation for affected land is based on replacement-cost principle in which a Land Valuation Committee established at the district level is responsible for (i) independent valuation of land/other assets and (ii) completion of land acquisition on behalf of Uttarakhand PWD.
- Indigenous Peoples Planning Framework: In addition to the RF, there is an exclusive IPP Framework in place intended to guide the selection and preparation of sub-projects where impacts on tribal people are identified to ensure better distribution of the project benefits and promote development of the indigenous peoples in the Project areas. The IPP Framework seeks to ensure that indigenous peoples and tribal communities are informed, consulted and mobilized to participate in the sub-project preparation.
- IPP Framework stipulates for preparation of an Indigenous Peoples Plan if a project directly or indirectly affects the dignity, human rights, livelihood systems, or culture of the IPs or affects the territories, or natural or cultural resources owned, used, occupied by IPs or claimed by them as their ancestral domain. Apart from providing a description of the project, an IPP should include (i) outcome of social impact assessment, (ii) preliminary outcome of initial information disclosure and consultations and provide approach and methodology to ensure the participation of IPs, (iii) details of beneficial measures, mitigation measures and capacity building, (iv) grievance redress mechanism, (v) arrangements for monitoring, reporting and evaluation, (vi) institutional arrangements for IPP implementation and (vii) budget and financing details.

2.2 **Resettlement Impact**

During the preparation of Project III, five sub project roads were found to have been affected by encroachment of ROWs and corridors occupied by informal settlers. After consultation and verification by NGO, 54 Household were reported to be affected by project activity. In order to minimize the impacts further, PWD decided to strengthen the road at the minimum construction requirement. It was found that in Pauri Bend Magnesite Factory subproject Road, impact on five encroachers can be avoided by slightly realigning/adjusting the road width. Now, the total Affected Household comes out to be 49 which were paid compensation as per the Entitlement Matrix. The resettlement impacts in 5 of the 89 roads sections, is summarized in Table- 2.

- 10. The Bank approved the 5 RPs in May 2012 for implementation and since then process of implementation began at grass root level by engaging a NGO called Himalayan Institute for Environment, Ecology & Development (HIFEED), Dehradun on 18 February 2013.
- 11. The implementation of the 5 RPs had total budget of Rs 7,139,582.5, of which (i) Rs 5922407.5 for Raitoli-Jasholi; (ii) Rs 131075 for Sahiya Damta Panuwa to Maletha Datunu Badnu Motor Marg (iii Rs. 127625 for Kalsi-Berath Khai Motor Marg to Kaha Nehra Unaha Motor Marg (iv) Rs. 831975 for Pauri Bend -Magnesite Factory (Parlichina- Magnesite Factory) and (v) Rs. 126500 for Miyali-Jakholi Motor Road including NGO implementation services.

3. APPROACH AND METHODOLOGY

12. The due diligence report has been prepared based on the scope of work of the NGO service, operational policy documents of the Asian Development Bank and the Resettlement Framework / Indigenous Peoples Planning Framework agreed upon by PWD, Government of Uttarakhand as part of the USRIP loan agreement. The methods followed for the preparation of due diligence report included (i) review and appraisal of sub-project reports and documents such as Resettlement Plan, Resettlement Framework, Indigenous Peoples Planning Framework, (ii) consultations with PMU/PMC ascertaining the compliance procedures adopted for various safeguard issues observed at the site and (iii) on-site observations and interactive meetings and discussions with the APs and other stakeholders.

4. SOCIAL SAFEGUARD DUE DILIGENCE

4.1 Ascertaining the Social Impacts through Joint Verification

13. A joint verification by PWD Personnel, Revenue Department officials and NGO representative was carried out. During the verification, it was found that 49 APs out of 54 APs were eligible for any sort of entitlements as per the policy guidelines. In the Pauri Bend Magnesite Factory (Parlichina-Magnesite

Factory) road, impacts on five structures owned by the encroachers were avoided by slightly realigning the road width.

14. During verification of APs it was observed that all were aware of proposed road improvement project and they expressed interest in receiving cash compensation for loss/damage to respective assets.

4.2 Land Acquisition and Compensation for Affected Persons

- 15. Land acquisition was unavoidable in one of the Subprojects, Raitoli-Jasholi Road in which, a total area of 6051 sq.mtr land belonging to a total number of 38 APs has been affected. During the DPR preparation, the total number of APs was identified as 11. However, during the ground verification carried out by the NGO, a Gol-Khata¹ has been identified with 27 titleholders who were having required documents of ownership claim. The compensation for the affected land has been decided based on one-to-one consultation with the respective land owners, in which they have agreed upon the latest circle rate as compensation. Being this a hilly stretch and also the affected area of land for each individual land owners is minor, all the APs agreed to the latest circle rates which are at par with market rate in the region. The Compensation made to Affected Household for their land compensation is given in Annexure 2.
- 16. The consultation with the affected APs reveals that there are no outstanding grievances with respect to the land acquisition or the compensation given thereof.
- 17. As agreed upon by the 38 APs, the copy of the Registry document after mutation has been kept in record.
- 18. In altogether, a total of 49 Household are being affected by the project activity. Among these, only 11 Household have lost their structures. Details of the type of structures, their uses and area affected are given below in Table 3. Value of the affected structures was assessed by the Civil Engineers of respective PIUs and NGO engaged for implementation of RPs. The valuation has followed the prevailing Circle rates as on date without depreciation, as envisaged in the Resettlement Framework. It was learnt that the Circle rates was last updated during the year 2012 and the same gets updated every two years. The compensation made to these affected household for their structure are given in Annexure 3.
- 19. As per the policy principle 7 of the SPS 2009, non-titled persons are eligible for non-land compensation which was also agreed during the ADB review mission. Hence, 4 non-title holders (encroachers) in Miyali Jakholi Road sub project were paid compensation for their structures and also provided rehabilitation assistance. (Copy of payment receipt are given in Annexure-4). During compensation, in one of the household in Miyali Jakholi road subproject, it was reported that the head of the family died few months back and now the affected household is a women headed household and hence eligible for the assistance for vulnerability. The payment for the vulnerability assistance is under process and the receipt will be provided in the next Monitoring report.

4.3 R&R Assistance for Affected APs

- 20. Apart from compensation to affected land or structure, resettlement assistance in the form of transitional allowance, shifting assistance, training on skill up gradation and income generation has been envisaged as per the Entitlement Matrix. However, since none of the APs are displaced from the existing location, or since all the affected land/structure are viable even after due impact, no APs are eligible for any resettlement assistance other than training in skill up gradation and income generation. There are some additional support to vulnerable group has been envisaged in the Entitlement Matrix if the primary source of income of respective vulnerable AP is lost. However no such incident identified and hence no resettlement assistance requires to be provided, except the skill up gradation / income generation training.
- 21. A total amount of Rs. 3,901,050/- has been paid to 49 APs in four respective sub-project roads. The details of the compensation paid in different sub-project roads are given in 4. Details of the amount of compensation disbursed for respective APs are given in Annexure-5. Copies of receipts of payments made to AP are given in Annexure-6.

22. RAP Implementing NGO has prepared the Micro Plans respectively for each AP and the same was verified and approved by the PMU and kept ready for disbursement in the month of June 2013. However, the actual disbursement of compensation was delayed due to the overall disturbances caused to the government systems in Uttarakhand mainly because of the natural disaster occurred in the month of June 2013.

4.4 Trainings for Skill up gradation and Income Generation

23. Following the guidelines given in Resettlement Framework, the NGO has identified the areas of training in which the APs or his/her family members could appropriately participate. Although there is no livelihood loss for any of the identified APs, NGO has conducted trainings on various areas, (i) rearing of Angora rabbit and cultivation of wool, (ii) fodder management for milch animals, (iii) cultivation and preservation of vegetable for commercial purpose, and (iv) information regarding specific centres

(district/block) from where APs/participants obtain further training and practical workshops. Training was imparted to 49 APs/family members and details of participants are given in 5. Names of participants are given in Annexure-7.

Interactive discussions with the APs/participants revealed that the trainees have good opinion about the trainings and they rated it as useful.

4.5 Impact on Scheduled Tribe population

Magnesite Factory)

- State of Uttarakhand is not part of notified Scheduled Area². Tribal population constitute 3% of the 25. total population of Uttarakhand, as per 2001 Census and the tribals are largely concentrated in the remote/forest areas of Tarai and Bhabar and higher reaches of Pithoragarh, Chamoli, Uttarkashi districts, and Jaunsar-Bhabar area of Dehradun district³.
- A total of three Scheduled Tribe Household were found to be affected in two sub project Road (2 26. HH in Kalsi Beratt Khai Kaha Nehra Panuwa Road and 1 in Sahiya Damta Datnu Badnu Motor Road). The affected Households were paid compensation and as well as the vulnerability assistance as per the ADB Guidelines.

4.6 Public consultation during planning and construction stage

During the DPR-preparation stage, extensive consultations were carried out with the APs as well 27. as with various administrative agencies directly and indirectly involved with the sub-project implementation. The most essential action that the PWD has carried out were the consultations with people along the road corridors who suggested for the reduction on width of ROW, and asked about the compensation and the types of assistance that would be provided for those that shall be affected by the road. The best example on the outcomes produced out of the consultations was the reduction in the widths of ROWs that eventually reduced the substantial number of APs. Consultations on compensation were also held with the heads of affected households by the staff of the Project Management Unit (PMU) prior to payment of compensation.

4.7 Disclosure process followed for safeguard and other related documents

Resettlement Framework along with Entitlement Matrix was translated into local language (Hindi) 28. and distributed to the people during the focus group discussions and public meetings. NGO has disseminated the relevant project information through an information campaign which was carried out during the month of March 2013.

² Constitution of India defines "Scheduled Areas" as such areas as the President may by order declare to be Scheduled Areas after consultation with the Governor of that State. The criteria for declaring any area as a "Scheduled Area" are; (a) preponderance of tribal population, (b) compactness and reasonable size of the area, (c) a viable administrative entity such as a district, block or Taluka, and (d) economic backwardness of the area as compared to the neighbouring areas.

4.8 Grievance Redress Mechanism followed for the Project

- 29. Resettlement Framework insists forming of a Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at the PIU level to deal with the disputes of APs and facilitate timely implementation of the sub-project. The GRC would be headed by the DC or a representative from Collector's Office. The members of the GRC would include representative from PIU office, representative of APs particularly of the vulnerable AP, representative from local government and RAP implementing NGO.
- 30. There were no outstanding grievances which were to be taken up to the GRC for that matter. NGO had carried out an appreciative job in this respect. The interactive discussions during the post-disbursement of compensation also revealed that APs are satisfied with the sup-project implementation works.

4.9 Details of Institutional Arrangement for Social Safeguards implementation

- 31. **Project Management Unit (PMU):** There is a dedicated Project Management Unit exclusively for the execution of USRIP, with an officer in the rank of Chief Engineer assumes lead role. Two officers in the rank of Executive Engineer at PMU assist the CE. Altogether 11 PIUs are responsible for the subproject roads grouped into 18 different packages. These PIUs are under the direct supervision of Executive Engineers of respective Divisions. A resettlement cell headed by a Resettlement Officer (RO) in the rank of Executive Engineer has been established for the project. Presently, there are two dedicated Officers placed at PMU respectively for the management of environmental and social safeguards. These Officers are adequately qualified with about 10 years of functional experience in environmental and social safeguards management in infrastructure development projects.
- 32. The RO at PMU is assisted by the Social Officer in the preparation and implementation of RPs. Social Officer at PMU coordinates with PIU established at PWD Circle level where one Assistant Engineer is appointed as Assistant Resettlement Officer (ARO).
- 33. Non-Government Organization for E&S Safeguards Implementation: the PMU has entrusted the task of implementing rehabilitation and resettlement under USRIP-3 to an NGO named Himalayan Institute for Environment, Ecology and Development (HIFEED) based at Dehradun as per the guidelines of ADB. The HIFEED has vast experience and expertise in development sector nationwide and was hired nationwide for implementation of RP. HIFEED has been provided with the responsibility of implementing 5 resettlement plans⁴ in the districts of Dehradun, Rudraprayag and Bageshwar. Contract agreement with HIFEED was signed on 18th February 2013 and the work was started on 25th February 2013.

4.10 Other Social Issues

34. NGO has conducted awareness programs on HIV/AIDS in 5 sub-project locations, the details of which are given in Table 6. Details of Participants along with Photographs of the program are given in Annexure-8. Regular surveillance to avoid child labour in the sub-project road civil works was done throughout the RP implementation.

5. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- 35. During the DPR preparation stage, PMU has taken all efforts to minimize the impact on land/structures and livelihood of villagers. Out of the 89 sub-project roads chosen for implementation, 5 sub-projects were having resettlement impacts, of which one road has the issue of land acquisition.
- 36. The key observations of the due diligence on the social impacts are summarised as follows:
 - NGO along with PMU/PIU has played appreciative role in carried out extensive consultations, interactive meetings and discussions with individual APs with respect to compensation and resettlement assistance. The rapport established by the NGO at the site has resulted in the smooth and timely implementation of the RP. The communities are aware of the project and have positively participated in the project activities. No outstanding grievances were reported during the construction stage or while during due diligence interactions;
 - Joint verification by PMU/PIU Personnel, Revenue Department officials and NGO representative has identified the eligible APs for compensation and resettlement assistance. As a result of the effective joint verification the number of eligible APs reduced to 49 from the previous number of 54;
 - During the DPR preparation stage, a total number of 11 APs would be having impact on land. However, during ground verification, a Gol-Khata was identified in which 27 land owners with appropriate ownership documents and was found eligible for compensation and assistance as envisaged in the Resettlement Framework;
 - Compensation for the affected lands was given as per the latest circle rates and was agreed upon through individual consultations with APs. Compensation for affected structures were estimated based latest Basic Schedule for Rates without depreciation;
 - The identified APs were not displaced from the existing location and also all the affected land/structure are viable even after due impact. The primary source of livelihood is also not lost for any of the identified vulnerable AP. A total amount of Rs. 3,901,050/- has been paid to 49 APs in four respective sub-project roads;
 - Institutional arrangements followed the guidelines of Resettlement Framework. Resettlement Cell with support from Social Officer and AROs at PIU level has regularly monitored the RAP implementation. Joint site verification, preparation of Micro Plan, disbursement of payments were done with due adherence to the agreed Resettlement Framework;
- 37. The due diligence study concludes that the project does not involve any outstanding social safeguard issues.
