### PANELISTS



**Daniel Kaufmann** is the President of Natural Resource Governance Institute (NRGI), a policy institute and nonprofit organization operating in more than a dozen countries. An economist, he is a pioneer in the field of governance and anti-corruption worldwide. Dr. Kaufmann is a non-resident fellow at the Brookings Institution, and has also held several high-level positions at the World Bank. He is a full member of the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative international board. Dr. Kaufmann, a Chilean, received an M.A. and Ph.D. in economics at Harvard, and a B.A. in economics and statistics from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.



**Alexia Latortue** is the Deputy Assistant Secretary for International Development Policy at US Treasury. Previously, Alexia was Deputy CEO of the Consultative Group to Assist the Poor (CGAP), housed at the World Bank and dedicated to advancing financial inclusion to improve the lives of the poor. At CGAP since 2002, Ms. Latortue moved to Washington, DC after spending four years running CGAP's Paris office. From Europe, she led CGAP's aid effectiveness work with a diversity of donors and investors, including multilateral development banks. Prior to that Alexia served in several development-related positions including director of a technical assistance program in Haiti. Alexia grew up in West Africa and Austria, and she has worked in developing countries around the world.



**M. Jae Moon** is Underwood Distinguished Professor of Public Administration at Yonsei University. He is currently Editor-in-Chief of International Review of Public Administration. Dr. Moon is an elected Fellow of National Academy of Public Administration (NAPA) and International Director of American Society for Public Administration. Earning Ph.D. from Syracuse University, he previously taught at the University of Colorado at Denver and Texas A & M University. His research interests include e-government and public management. He has been selected as one of 100 most cited public administration scholars. In 2015, his article was also selected as one of the most influential 75 pieces published in Public Administration Review which celebrates the 75th anniversary. He was the recipient of Mosher Award and the Peter Boorsma Award for International Scholar in 2009.



**Shahmar Movsumov** is the Chief Executive Officer of State Oil Fund of the Republic of Azerbaijan since 2006. He had previously held the post of the General Director of the Central Bank of Azerbaijan. He is also the Chairman of the Government Commission on the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative. He graduated from the Department of International Economic Relations of Moscow State Institute of International Relations and got his Master's degree from John Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University.



**Charlotte Slente** is Ambassador and Special Envoy for Fragile States in the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Previously, she served as State Secretary for Development Policy and before that as Under-Secretary for Development Policy and Global Challenges and was overall responsible in the Ministry for Danish Official Development Cooperation. She also held the position as Under-Secretary for Consular Affairs in the Ministry for two years. Preceding these appointments she served as Denmark's Ambassador to Bolivia, Ecuador and Peru, posted in La Paz, Bolivia.
