

PROJECT LOCATIONS

1. The target location for the project varies according to the activity area which is described as either (i) provinces or (ii) hospital (either provincial hospital or district referral hospitals).
2. The project locations vary according to (i) the output/activity area, (ii) the support provided under original project, and (iii) the need for continued support for the activity area to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The project locations are described in Table 1.
