Indicative expected results are the aggregate results planned to be achieved by projects for which a completion report (i.e., project completion report, TA completion report, and extended annual review report) is expected to be circulated during the CPS reporting period, which spans 2023–2027 for the Cambodia CPS, 2024–2028. The expected results are indicative values only; the specific target values that will be used to evaluate the effectiveness of ADB country programming in the country assistance program review will be based on project completion reports circulated during the CPS period.
