Attached below are the 2 resettlement completion reports prepared by EMA of REDSIP (Punjab) for Chianwali and Deg Outfall projects. After multiple reviews of the reports and revisions made to address our comments, the reports are acceptable and being cleared for disclosure. Please note that for Chianwali project, PPMU has to pay 2.21 million to a leaseholder who unfortunately died. This amount is to be paid to the legal heirs of the deceased leaseholder. district court/revenue department is in the process of issuing a succession certificate to the heirs.

The PPMU has already transferred the payable amount to the account of Land Acquisition Collector for payment to the heirs. Please advise PPMU to assist the deceased family in obtaining the succession certificate and inform ADB about the compensation, when disbursed to the heirs.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. The “Renewable Energy Development Sector Investment Program (REDSIP)” is being implemented with the assistance of Asian Development Bank (ADB Loan No. 2286-PAK). The Chianwali Hydropower project (Upper Chenab Canal RD-131+250) is 3rd No of the 5 proposed small to medium hydropower projects ranging from 2.82 MW to 7.64MW which are at different stages of implementation in the Punjab Province. To meet the ADB safeguard requirements, a Resettlement Plan (RP) of Chianwali HPP was prepared by PPMU and approved by ADB on November, 2010 for its implementation.

2. To confirm and validate the implementation of RP, this final external resettlement completion/monitoring report has been prepared by external monitoring consultant based on the field survey conducted from 10 – 14 February, 2017. The major findings of the report are as under:

- i). Out of total 26 affected households (AHs land owners), the payment of land compensation has been made to 25 AHs, while payment to 1 AH is pending due to a court case pertaining to land ownership dispute and land division. The compensation amount of this leftover case has already been transferred to Land Acquisition Collector (LAC), which will be paid on the court decision.
- ii). Crop compensation to all AHs (land owners) has been paid while remaining compensation to 1 AH (Ch. Nawaz Bajwa) is pending due to succession certificate to be issued to the heirs of Late Nawaz Bajwa. PPMU will release crop compensation to the heirs as soon as they provide succession certificate to PPMU.
- iii). Lease amount of land has already been paid to Evacuee Trust Property Board (ETPB) vide Government of the Punjab Cheque No.167613 dated 04.06.2014. Thus, the full payment has been made.

3. In view of exhaustive efforts of PPMU in making payments to all AHs, the EMA confidently concludes that the RP of Chianwali has been now implemented with 25 of total 26 AHs fully compensated. The only AH whose payment is pending needs to provide a succession certificate to PPMU and he will be fully compensated once he meets this requirement. The land needed for the project (74.5 acres; mix of 52.1 acres of government and 22.46 acres of private land) has been fully acquired and transferred unencumbered to the project name. There are no any outstanding grievances but the committee formed to resolve community's grievances is still in place and will continue to function till full completion of the project.

4. Based on above facts, EMA concludes that RP has been implemented satisfactorily and no further monitoring reports of RP is needed. However, PPMU will have to inform to ADB about the payment to 1 AH when based on the succession certificate to be issued by District Revenue Department.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

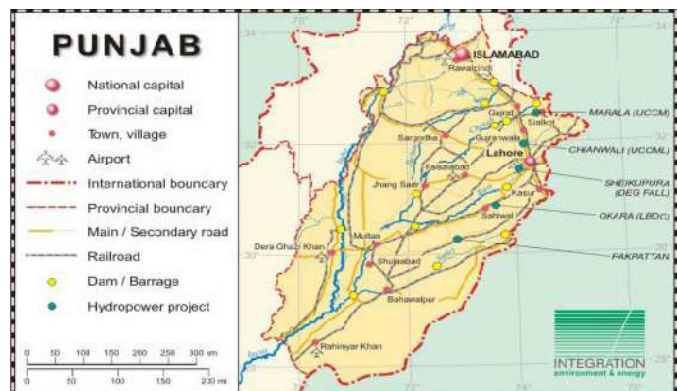
1. The Government of Punjab, Pakistan is implementing the project of “Renewable Energy Development Sector Investment Program¹ (REDSIP)”, with the assistance of Asian Development Bank (ADB Loan No. 2286-PAK). The feasibility studies of 5 projects including i) Pakpattan, ii) Marala, iii) Chianwali, iv) Deg Outfall and v) Okara Hydro Power Projects have already been conducted during 2005 by WAPDA through Consultants. The construction of five small to medium hydropower stations ranging from 2.82 MW to 7.64 MW is being implemented in the Punjab province, while the preparation of feasibility studies of other additional five sites have also been completed under this Loan. Based on the feasibility studies, the project of Chianwali HPP (at Upper Chenab Canal RD-131+250) is being implemented for the generation of 5.38 MW energy and is at advance stage of completion. The Chianwali hydro power project is located in the vicinity of village Chianwali, Tehsil and District Gujranwala, Punjab.

2. This is the final external resettlement completion/monitoring report for the implementation of resettlement plan for Chianwali HH Project. This report is to confirm and validate the implementation status of the RP based on the data provided by the PPMU, validation through field survey and consultations with affected persons and local community.

1.2 Project Description

3. The CHPP is being constructed on the Upper Chenab Canal (UCC), at RD 129+000 to RD 133+000. The powerhouse is being constructed at RD 131+250. The run-of-canal site for CHPP is found between Kamoke and Gujranwala towns, near Chianwali village and the Irrigation Rest House. It is about 55 km from Lahore and 6 km from Gujranwala at UCC RD 131+250 and initial section of the project area is parallel to the Grand Trunk Road (G.T. Road) at a distance of half kilometer.

4. The scope of civil works activities start from the fall structure at RD 128+000 to the fall at RD 164+000 of the UCC. The CHPP consists of combination of two falls to utilize the head for Energy output. A Power Canal in bypass arrangement along with Power House at right side between RD at RD 129+000 to RD 133+000 of UCC is being constructed. It includes intake section, gated spillway, power house, and tail race section etc. The bed level and embankment of Power Canal upstream of Power House are

being raised according to cross sections from RD 128+000 to Power House. Location Map & Aerial view of the Chianwali Hydro Power project site presented in Annex A.

5. The Chianwali Hydropower project (5.38 MW) comprises the construction of the following components:

- i). Construction of Power Canal works in by-pass arrangement between RD 129+256 to RD 133.035 on right side of UCC.
- ii). Raising of existing UCC embankments from upstream of Power location up to RD 128+000 according to remodeled cross sections. Similarly, excavation of UCC bed from downstream of Power House location up to RD 164+400 according to remodeled cross sections.
- iii). Construction of new District road bridges adjacent to the existing fall cum Village Road Bridges at RD 128+000 and RD 164+400 of UCC and dismantling the existing Fall cum Bridges at the same RDs.
- iv). Construction of new Bridges at RD 128+000 adjacent to the existing Bridges with piles foundations at RD 139+165 and RD 148+669 of UCC and dismantle the VR Bridges with shallow foundations at same locations.
- v). Construction of protection works for such Project area including station etc.
- vi). Construction of feeder canal and associated structures to ensure the required discharge for three off taking distributaries downstream of Power House.
- vii). Gated spillway structure with service Bridges.
- viii). Power House buildings and ancillary structures including Machine Hall, Control Building, Intake and outlet bays with cut-offs, and retaining walls etc.
- ix). Paving of 2.5 Km (approx) long and 4.5 m wide access road with double surface treatment.
- x). Offices and Residences for the Employer and Contractor's temporary Colony and infrastructure.

6. The location map of the project is presented in Annex-A of the report.

1.3 Objectives of External Monitoring

7. The external monitoring refers to the collection, analysis, reporting and use of information relating to the progress of resettlement based on Entitlement matrix/ RP. The monitoring is an integral part during the implementation of RP and facilitates to assess the implementation progress and decision making. The major objective of the report is to conduct monitoring for the implementation of RP including consultations, payment of compensation, grievance redress mechanism to redress the community concerns including females & other vulnerable groups.

8. Thus, the implementation progress of the approved RP is monitored to determine the updated progress on implementation status and to validate the payment made to the entitled APs; and suggest remedial measures/ corrective action plan for the leftover activities.

9. In order to accomplish the objectives, the following aspects have been studied; i) review the implementation status of resettlement activities including eligibility, entitlements, payment of compensation, adequacy of budget, timeliness and institutional arrangements; ii) review of community complaints/ grievance redress methods/ system of the project; iii) conduct consultations with the APs, community and other stakeholders; and iv) suggest the remedial measures.

2 APPROACH AND METHODOLOGY

10. This section of the report covered the review of progress of implementation of RP including status of disbursement of payment to DPs, redress of community complaints, community consultations, data validation and analysis. Both primary and secondary data was collected. The primary data collected based on the field survey includes consultations (3 Nos.) comprising of 18 participants (affectees and local community) in which concerns/ feedback of APs as well as local community were noted. The secondary data includes published data/ reports including PPMU progress reports/ internal monitoring reports, resettlement data files/ record and relevant websites.

11. The field survey/ meetings activities were continued from 25 Jan – 30 Jan 2017 and 10 Feb – 14 Feb, 2017; and results were shared with the Project Director and AD (Env/Resettlement), PPMU. All collected data/ information from different sources were inputted and analysis was made to drive results.

3 PUBLIC CONSULTATIONS

3.1 General

12. Consultation and participation are central to the achievement of ADB safeguard policy objectives. The consultations with AHs/ other public are significantly important to get the feedback regarding social issues associated with the implementation of the resettlement plan. In this context, three consultations (consisting of 18 participants) were made with the APs/ local community to get their feedback regarding the implementation of resettlement activities under the Chianwali HP project.

3.2 Feedback by the APs and other Local People

13. Based on the consultations made with the APs, who have received their entitled payments and the APs who were under the process of payment. The APs and other locals pointed out that in general there would be economic and social development of the area due to the implementation of this project.

14. The following were the major feedback/ concerns of APs/ and local population:

- The majority of the population resided was happy with the construction of Chianwali hydro power project.
- The construction of Chianwali hydro power project will bring a change in the social and economic development of the area due to the increase in income generation activities. Consequently, the employment, income and ultimately living standard will be increased.
- Local community appreciated hiring of 10 local labourers in the project construction;
- Community requested for dirt track used as access road to be black topped which the project considered undertaking during project construction;

15. A list of APs/ other villagers participated in the consultative meetings is presented in Annex-B.

4 STATUS OF RP IMPLEMENTATION

16. The project impacts reflected in resettlement plan are presented in Table 4.1.

4.1 Project Impacts

17. The project necessitated acquisition of 74.56 acres which has been fully acquired. The land acquired included 52.10 acres of government land owned by Evacuee Trust Property Board, while remaining 22.46 acres included the private land. In total 26 land owners and 2 leaseholders were affected due to land acquisition, crops and trees losses.

18. The project also affected 3,874 wood trees. All owned by Government's Forest Department and thus no private trees were affected. No other infrastructure or structures, e.g. any structures whether community, commercial agricultural or residential were affected by the project.

4.2 Status of Compensation Payment

19. The status of payment of compensation is as below:

- i). Out of total 26 affected households (AHs land owners), the payment of land compensation has been made to 25 AHs, while payment to 1 AH will be made after the court of law decides the land ownership dispute in the family. The compensation amount has been transferred to the Land Acquisition Collector (LAC), who will pay to the land owner(s) as the court would decide.
- ii). Of the total crop compensation of Rs. 3.35 million, 8 crop owners and one leaseholder AP have been paid an amount of Rs. 1.14 million while the remaining amount of Rs. 2.21 million is ready to be paid to the heirs of 2nd leaseholder Mr. Nawaz Bajwa who unfortunately died. A succession certificate needs to be issued to the heirs of Mr. Bajwa, which is under process by district revenue authority. The heirs will be paid after the district revenue authority issues the certificate. The payable amount has been transferred to the LAC's account for payment.
- iii). Lease amount of land has already been paid to Evacuee Trust Property Board (ETPB) vide Government of the Punjab Cheque No. 167613 dated 04.06.2014. Thus, the full payment has been made.
- iv). The project affected 3874 wood trees owned by Forest Department and PPMU provided Rs. 3.8 million to the Forest Department for replantation of trees. No private trees, structures or any other infrastructure was affected by the project.

20. Compensation payment details are given in Table 4.1, while AP-wise details are presented in Annex I & II.

4.3 Disclosure Information Brochure/ Pamphlets

21. The information brochure summarizing the provisions of the RP have been given to all the families whose land, trees, crops or other assets and incomes are affected by the HPP. The objective was to inform the APs/ locals regarding entitled compensation and rehabilitation assistance and of a number of basic issues relative to the modalities of implementation of the compensation and rehabilitation program. The Information Brochures/ Booklets (in Urdu language) were already distributed among affected persons.

5 CONCLUSIONS

22. In view of exhaustive efforts of PPMU in making to payments to all AHs, the EMA confidently concludes that the RP of Chianwali has been now implemented with 25 of total 26 AHs fully compensated. The only AH whose payment is pending needs to provide a succession certificate to PPMU and he will be fully compensated once he meets this requirement. The land needed for the project (74.5 acres: mix of 52.1 acres of government and 22.46 acres of private land) has been fully acquired and transferred unencumbered to the project name. There are no any outstanding grievances but the committee formed to resolve community's grivecances is still in place and will continue to function till full completion of the project.
