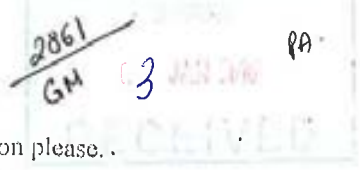

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Project Background

The North Eastern State Roads Investment Programme (NESRIP) is a joint initiative of the Government of India and the Asian Development Bank.

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) had approved for financial support to Government of India towards the cost of proposed North Eastern State Roads Investment Program (NESRIP) to (i) improve about 430 kms of priority road sections under Tranche-1 and Tranche-2 in six states in North Eastern Region (NER) of India and (ii) provide capacity building support to the executing agency of NESRIP ; the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER); and implementing agencies (IAs). the State Public Works Department (PWD) or its equivalent in each state. A total length of 433.7 kms of roads and bridges covering six NE States, excluding Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland is proposed to be taken up for construction / upgradation during Tranche I & II. Tranche I comprising the States of Assam, Meghalaya and Sikkim will cover a total road length of 202.3 kms and Tranche – II comprising Assam, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura will cover the remaining road length of 231.4 kms.

Under Tranche -II of NESRIP, the road section of 20.23 km between Udaipur and Melaghar, in Tripura has been identified for rehabilitation and up-gradation, under civil works package TR-CW1.

The Project road, Udaipur (on NH-44) to Melaghar (TR-02), in the state of Tripura, is a Major District Road (MDR). The entire Project road section provides connectivity to melaghar near Bangladesh border. Melaghar is also connected directly by another road to NH-44 providing shorter link to Agartala. The road is important for International border trade between India and Bangladesh.

1.2 Project Description

This Report of Environmental Management plan Implementation is concerned with the sub-project road i.e. SH. The details of concerned sub-project are presented in **Table-1**, the Environmental Management plan (EMP) of which is being implemented as a part of project component:

The project road is currently a single / intermediate lane and falls under two Districts in the state of Tripura viz. Gomati and Shipahijala. The entire Project road section lies in East Tripura District. The length of the road as per TOR is 20.3 km. The project section takes off from NH-44 at Udaipur (Gomati district) and travels in West direction to meet Bishramganj-Sonamura State Highway at Melaghar in Shipahijala. The project road is a Major District Road connecting Udaipur and Melaghar via Kakraban, which is apparently the mid-point of the project corridor. The start point of the project corridor at Udaipur is 55.200 km from the State capital, Agartala with starting chainage 0.00 km.

The built-up area is generally concentrated along the road.

Land use along the project road is mainly agricultural and built up areas scattered along. In rolling terrain the forest area has scanty plantation, except shrubs. The river Gomati crosses the Project road at km 13. For considerable Length the Project road aligned along the river bank, sometimes close to the river. The project influence area lies approximately in Seismic Zone V.

The project road ends at Melaghar at the junction with another MDR joining Melaghar to NH and leading to Agartala

The project will rehabilitate the deteriorated and damaged state road corridors to provide reliable road transport services and, hence, reduce poverty in the long term. As far as possible the project aimed at up-gradation and rehabilitation of existing state highways with limited amount of land acquisition following the existing alignment. The purpose of adopting up-gradation and rehabilitation within ROW and following the existing alignment was nothing but to reduce the social impact in its immediate environment to the maximum extent possible.

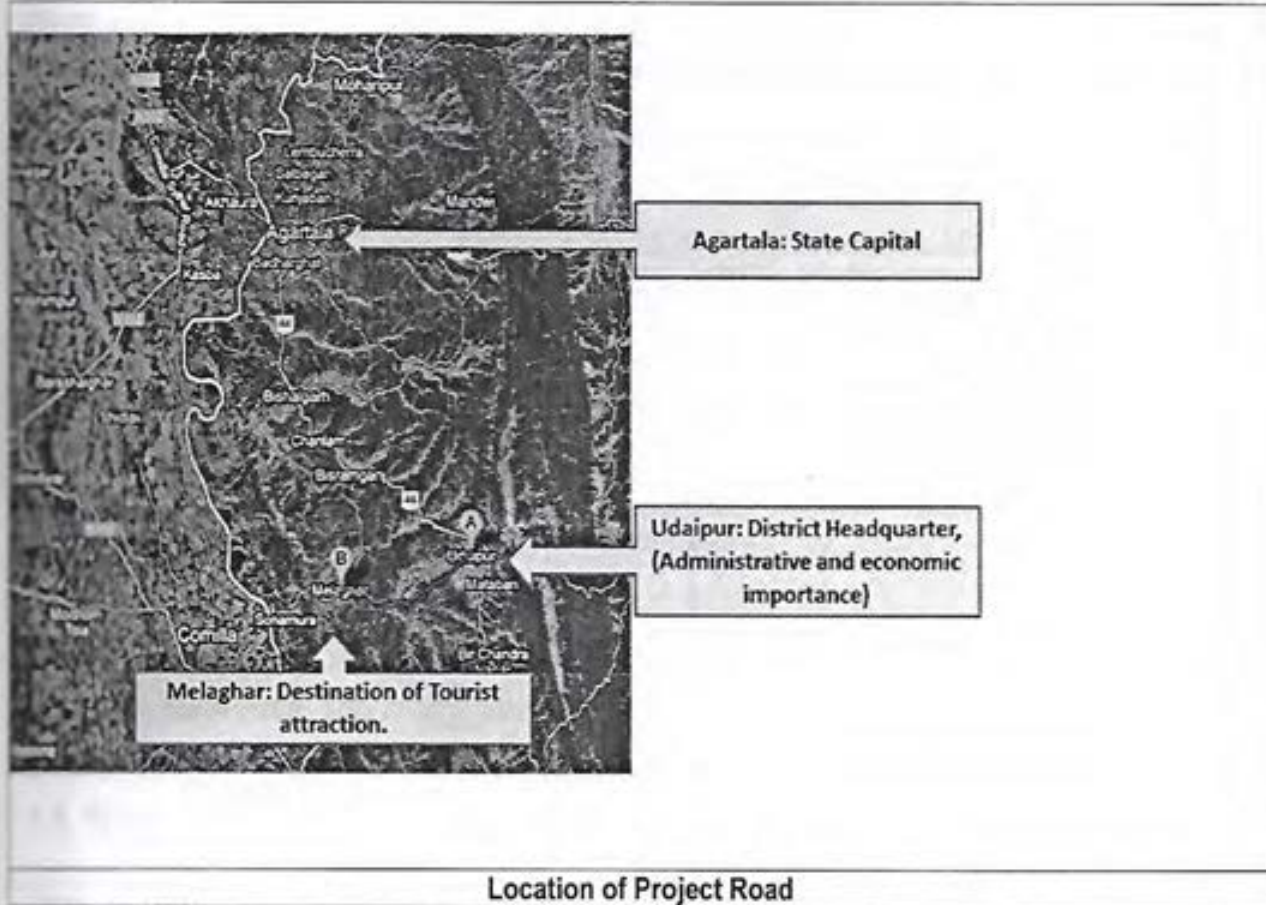
The condition of the existing road was poor as at many places the pavement was no more exists. There were villages in regular interval with many squatters and encroachers living or doing business along the road.

The section of State Highways is located in Gomoti and Shipaijala districts. It starts from NH-44 Udaipur town and terminates at MDR in Melaghar. It passes through Ramesh Chwmoni, Khilpara, Jamjuri, Palatana, Kakraban, Kishoreganj, Kamrangatoli, Mohanbhog and Melaghar in the districts of Gomoti and Shipaijala (Tripura). The start point of Project road is at Ramesh Chwmoni (Km. 0.000) and end point is at Melaghar (Km. 20.23). The total length of the road is 20.23 Km.

Project Objectives

- Upgradation/improvement of 20.23 km of state highway Road
- Improving the conditions of the existing road network by carrying out rehabilitation and reconstruction works that are mostly confined within the existing right-of-way (ROW).
- Strengthening /reconstruction of the existing carriageway, bringing the roads to standard width, improvement of the safety features and making provisions of adequate signage.

1.3 Environmental Category

TR-02 roads existing and no realignments are proposed. All impacts are site specific, few are irreversible and related to minor alignment correction and road widening, and all impacts can be readily mitigated. Therefore all the contract packages fall under B Category as per ADB categorization criteria based on ADB's Environmental Assessment Guidelines 2003, and Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS) 2009. The project required only IEE for meeting the environmental requirements under the ADB's policy. Environmental Management Plan (EMP) was formulated for mitigating and managing the anticipated adverse environmental impacts and enhancing the efficiency of environmental components wherever it is possible. The recommended EMP was included in domain of detailed and bid document for all the packages. There is a separate budgetary allocation for implementation of EMP and have been included in the contracts.

1.4 Scope of Report

The present report is the first Environmental Monitoring Report covering the period from January 2016 to June 2016. The report reviews the compliances of environmental activities set in EMP during the period and processes practices/innovations leading to improved and sustainable environment in the future.

1.5 Scope of environmental work

Carry out the following duties related to environmental management: (a) ensure that the construction methods as proposed by the Contractor for carrying out the works are satisfactory, with particular reference to the technical requirements of Acts, Rules, Guidelines and Standards, as also the stipulation of competent Environmental Authority that are applicable to the Project, (b) supervise and monitor the implementation of environmental mitigation measures stipulated in the Environmental Management Plan (EMP) (in Annexed - 1) prepared as part of the Initial Environmental Examination Report (IEE), (c) timely detect any unexpected environmental impacts and coordinate with the Employer to implement necessary mitigation measures; (d) undertake the environmental monitoring works; (e) supervise other related environmental work decided by the Employer, and (f) prepare monitoring reports on the implementation of the EMP. The IEE will be provided by the Employer to the Consultant during the proposal preparation period

2.0 Overall project progress

PROJECT PROGRESS STATUS AND IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

A comparison of the progress at end of June 2016 is summarized as below.

A. Progress Status of Construction Activities

The construction activities are erection and commissioning of plant (Batching plants) under progress. Utilities shifting and tree cutting is also in progress.

a) Construction Camps

b) Tree Cutting Status

There is so far no permit required for permission of using ground water from the 'Ground Water Board'.The Contractor of NIESRIP , Trench -II has been obtained labour license and Workmen Compensation Insurance. Contractors has been obtained Consent to Establish/ (NOC) for the Hot Mix plant and WMM , for Batch mixed Plants application has been applied to pollution control board for CTE. Contractor of TR-02 has been

instructed to immediately apply / submit for the CTO , and Pollution under Control Certificate (PUC) for vehicles engaged on construction activity.

Regarding CTO, the Contractor shall apply for CTO after obtaining CTE. Details of statutory clearances are given in **Table No- 3..**

5.0 Compliance status with environmental management and monitoring plans as stipulated in the environmental documentation as agreed with ADB:

The Project management unit (PMU) in consultation with the Project Management Consultant has formulated standard format a reporting system on environmental management aspects to be reported by the CSCs to PMU for monitoring the implementation of EMMP. The information shared in these monitoring reports includes statutory clearances, environmental monitoring status at construction sites, measures for workers safety at construction site and camp site, and control measures being adopted etc.

For the effective management, implementation of the EMMP, the supervision consultants have designated their existing site staff for environmental coordination. Contractors for the respective contract have designated

Environmental Officers for the sound implementation of EMP. CSC have Environmental Specialist to closely monitor the - TR- 02 implementation of environmental management and monitoring plan (EMMP) for all the project road

Implementation of EMMP during the reporting period shall be complied and further needs to be strengthened in the areas such as monitoring of environmental quality, safety arrangements and usage of personal protective equipment by the workers.

6.0 Approach and methodology engaged for environmental monitoring of the project

Environment is important to ensure that environmental impacts are prevented and mitigated in conformity with the EMP, ADB safeguards to ensure that sound road developmental practices are followed for the protection of the environment and social aspects.

In TR-02 road , the Construction work is in full swing. PWD has commissioned the services of a Construction Supervision Consultant to supervise the construction activity including implementation of Environmental Management Plan by Contractor.

Constant monitoring of EMMP implementation on under construction projects is also being carrying out by Assisting Engineers (SDOs) of Kakraban Sub division and Siphajjala Sub- division . Concerned staff of SDOs regularly visit the construction sites and report to team leader about issues related to the environment and non- compliances of measures as given in EMP. Necessary directions, in case of non-compliances, are being given to the contractor on the site and through the writings about the procedures to resolve the issues or requirements.

The Construction supervision consultant shall be submitted periodic report that includes information on implementation of EMMP. The environmental information will captures in these reports includes statutory clearances obtained by contractor, environmental; monitoring status of construction sites, pollution control measures being adopted, and measures for workers safety at construction site and camp site etc. adopted, and measures for workers safety at construction site and camp site etc. The reporting is however, intermittent for project and steps are being taken for improving the reporting quality.

The Construction Supervision Consultant shall also be organized training program on "Implementation of Environmental Management & Monitoring Plan (EMMP)" for the Contractor under their CSC with an aim to provide training to the Contractor and improve compliance with environmental mitigation measures provided in contract documents and as agreed with ADB (Annexure -1).The PIU staff, Supervision Consultant, and Contractor's key staff were invited to attend the. The various issues covered in this training program includes Environmental Safeguards Requirements, Environmental Management & Monitoring Plan, Implementation of

EMMP, Roles and Responsibilities of ADB's/ Client's/ Consultant's/Contractor, Clearances Required for Project, Challenges in Implementing EMMP, and further ensure "AIDS awareness Program shall be conducted as soon as possible etc.

7.0 Monitoring of environmental receptors/attributes (e.g. ambient air, surface water, noise etc.)

Besides regular on site monitoring for the implementation of Environmental Management Plan, air quality, water quality and noise levels were required to be monitored to check any adverse impact due to construction activities and to ensure that plants and machineries working on project do not pollute the surrounding environment. The monitoring of environmental variables was carried out as per the agreed Environmental Monitoring Plan.

The Contractor has to be hired the services of environmental monitoring laboratories; accredited by NABL to monitor the environmental parameters. The environmental attributes to be monitored include the air, noise and water quality parameters at the proposed construction sites in the project corridors. In air quality the parameters monitored include PM₁₀, PM_{2.5}, SO₂, NO_x, and CO. The water quality parameters include temperature, pH, EC, TDS, BOD, COD, Hardness, Calcium, Magnesium, Chloride, Sulphate, total coliform, etc. The parameters monitored are also compared with the Bureau of Indian Standard.

The baseline environmental monitoring has already been conducted in TR-02 and detailed results for ambient air quality, water quality, and soil quality and noise levels are provided in IEE reports¹

Subsequently a comprehensive environmental monitoring plan has been prepared and provided in IEE Report. The monitoring program has been designed focusing monitoring during construction and operation stage. The following Environmental Parameters shall be monitored:

- a) Ambient Air Quality Monitoring
- b) Water Quality
- c) Noise Level Monitoring
- d) Soil Quality Monitoring

8.0 Any other environmental aspects, impacts observed during implementation which were not covered earlier

There is no such environmental aspect that was not covered earlier.

8.1 Status of Environmental Monitoring Plan Implementation

During the initial construction phase and during the construction stage environmental monitoring has not been conducted till (January 2016 to June 2016),

The contractor has been instructed to carry out the environmental monitoring as per the environmental monitoring plan provided in IEE report and submit a copy of the monitored results on regular basis. Since the project is in a very infant stage hence mostly construction activities are being undertaken.

9.0 Details of complaints received from public and action taken thereof to resolve

It would be pertinent here to refer the Asian Development Bank's policy, which requires proper mechanisms for resolution of disputes that may arise from any aspect of the compensation and development process. The mechanisms should be "affordable and accessible," and third parties independent of the implementers should be available at the appropriate point in the process. The grievance procedure need to be simple, administered in the first instance at the local level to facilitate access, flexibility and open to various proofs taking into account the need for speedy, just and fair resolution of their grievances.

In the course of EMP implementation for this project, the Executing Agency facilitated with the help of NGO/SC for the constitution of Grievances Redressal Committee (GRC) at district level for the sub-project road.

Moreover, one grievance received/ reported from the field which has been addressed by Additional Collector. During the field visit of Environmental expert there is no any grievances were received from the a along the project corridor population.

There was no any major accident and grievances, received from the project road, however, if any grievances and doubts of the villagers shall be redressed in future , that time by the Executing Agency with the consultation of local community/ authorities, and through awareness campaign will resolve the issues etc. further there is need to work on other activities of EMP implementation. Such activities are related with:

- EMP implementation training program / Workshop,
- Information on Labour on Construction site, plants site and safety précautions etc.

So far, no complaints from public have been received regarding any items, especially EMP, of construction work in different contract packages.

10.0 Follow-up actions and conclusion

Site observations issues –:

The copy of Consent to Establish (CTE/ NOC) for HMP/Drum Mix Plant, WMM has been submitted and Copy of application of Batching plant has been submitted

The Contractor has been submitted the documentary evidence (Chalan copy) of license quarry of Akhaura, Agartala

PUC Certificates of all Construction Vehicles.

Borrow area layout and landowners agreement.

Copy of application submitted to SEIAA for Borrow Area approval, if any and subsequently the approval of the same.

Construction Camp details along with Camp layout plan and Landowner's Agreement.

Details of proposed Environmental Monitoring Agency for Environmental Monitoring along the project section and Environmental Monitoring Plan (Quarterly) throughout the project period, except monsoon period.

Details of identified debris disposal site along with land owner's agreement , is has been observed many places all along the alignment .

Deployment of Environmental Officer by 1st week of Oct 2015. But during the site visit there is o any environmental office on site

Contractor has been conducted HIV /AIDS program on date 24th -04-2016 .

The detailed layout of identified sensitive locations such as school/college/hospital along the project road for provision of Noise barrier as per design shall be submitted by the Contractor as soon as possible . The same shall be discussed and finalized jointly by the Consultant & Client still pending .

The detailed layout of identified cultural property/school along the project road for provision of sitting bench as per design shall be submitted by the Contractor as soon as possible . The same shall be discussed and finalized jointly by the Consultant & Client.

Actions Required

- a) Adequate safety provisions should be implemented in project road at bridge, CD's structures as well as construction work fronts.
- b) Provision of safe, potable drinking water in labour camp as well as construction work fronts
- c) All the CD's locations taken up for the construction are very much in unsafe condition and instructed to immediately barricade those locations with guiding signboards placement on either approaches of the work locations
- d) Procurement, distribution and training towards use of PPEs for all TR-02 road , especially for those working with bitumen and concrete work
- e) Proper election, designing and operation of debris, excavated materials, and scarified materials should be dump during the construction stage.

- f) Proper prevention/ measures of oil spillage at HMP construction sites, waste oil and lubricants containment, storage/handling and safe confinement of such spillages.
- g) Instructed Bituminous dust /fines from the Bag filters of HMP need to be collected stored and disposed of time to time but still not compliances
- h) Road Inspections along with Environment Specialist PIUs , FE & Project Manager of Contractor to assess EMP Compliance & onsite explanation of non-compliance, if found any and to further advise to bring improvement in compliance of the same.

Follow up actions and Conclusions

Supervision consultants has assessed that the implementation of EMP during the reporting period, some areas such as HMP , WMM Plant, safety arrangements, traffic management and usage of personal protective equipment (PPE) by the construction workers require to be improved further. CSC has instructed the civil work Contractor to take immediately appropriate mitigation actions to improve implementation of traffic , worker safety and safety measures at CDs as well as all along the road alignment , and to ensure that all workmen and staff employed on site use safety gear provided to them. Correspondence has been made to contractor regarding health and safety maintenance, implementation of EMP etc. Following are the major issues for the follow up in the next monitoring period:

- ★ The supervision consultants has advised the contractor to obtain all statutory clearances like consent to establish and operate plants and Machineries from Tripura State Pollution Control Board.
- ★ Monitoring of EMP implementation work at site.
- ★ Contractor of TR-02 has been instructed to immediately finalized the environmental Monitoring agency (NABL accredited), which will be carried out the Environmental Monitoring.

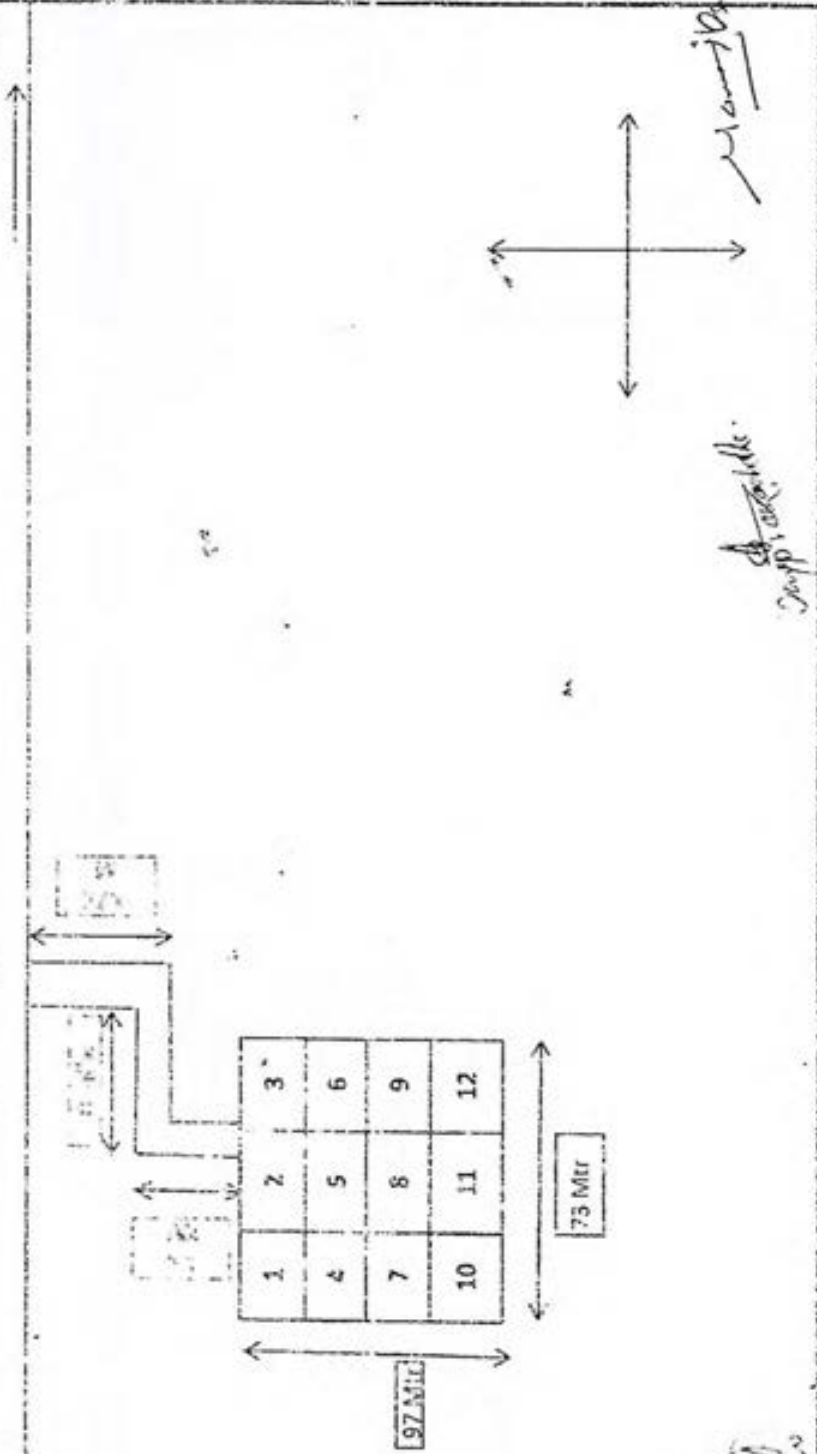

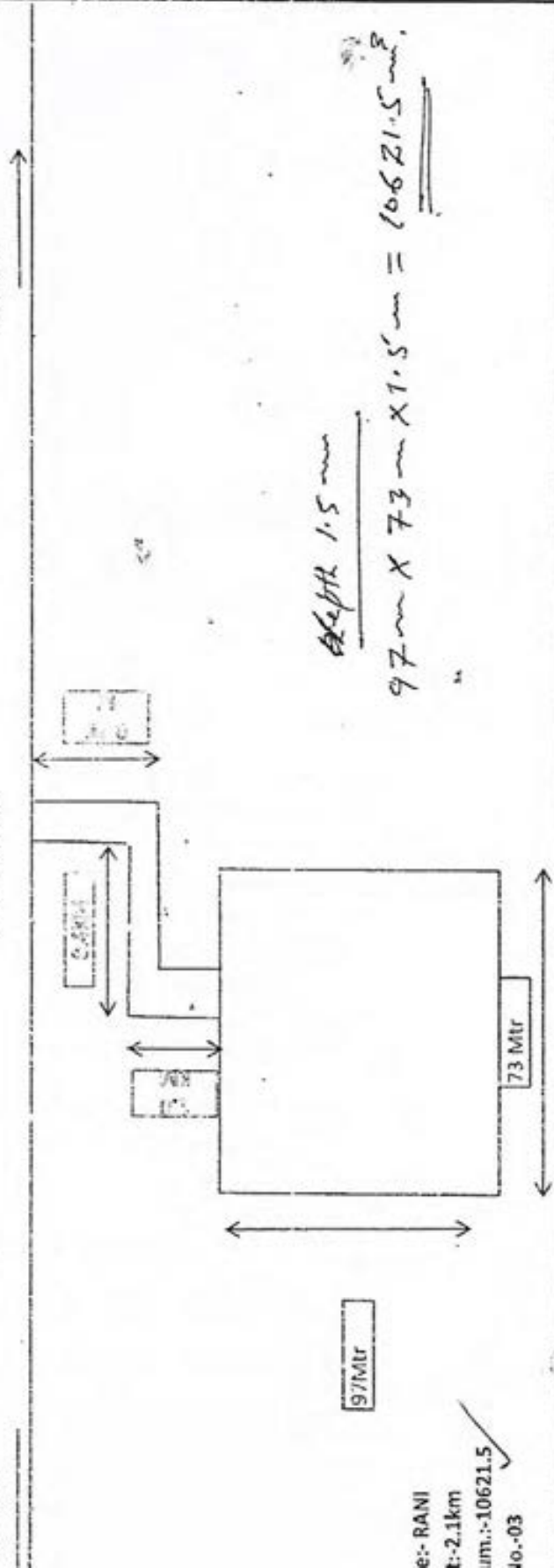

PROVISIONS APPLYING TO SECTION - I

Memo 1. 
