DEFINITION OF TERMS

Affected Household (AH)	:	Any household physically and/or economically directly affected because of land acquisition and involuntary resettlement. Household means all persons living and eating together as a single social unit.
Affected Person (AP)	:	Refer to all of the people who would have their (1) standard of living adversely affected; or (2) right, title, interest in any house, land (including premises, agricultural and grazing land) or any other fixed or moveable asset acquired or possessed temporarily or permanently; (3) access to productive assets adversely affected, temporarily or permanently; or (4) business, occupation, work or place of residence or habitat adversely affected; and “displaced person” means any of the displaced persons.
Compensation	:	Refers to payment in cash or in kind for an asset or resource that is acquired or affected by a Project at the time the asset needs to be replaced. All compensation is based on the principle of replacement cost, which is the method of valuing assets to replace the loss at current market rates, plus any transaction costs such as administrative charges, taxes, registration and titling costs.
Consultations	:	A process that (i) begins early in the project preparation stage and is carried out at different stages of the project and land acquisition and involuntary resettlement cycle; (ii) provides timely disclosure of relevant and adequate information in Khmer language that is understandable and readily accessible to affected person; (iii) is undertaken in an atmosphere free of intimidation or coercion with due regard to cultural norms; and (iv) is gender inclusive and responsive, and tailored to the needs of disadvantaged and vulnerable groups; enables to consider the incorporation of all relevant views of affected people and other stakeholders into decision making, such as project design, mitigation measures and implementation issues.
Corridor of Impacts (COI)	:	Refers to the area within 20m of width along the transmission line (10m to each side from the centerline of transmission line) to determine the impacts on lands and assets.
Cut-off Date	:	Refers to the date established to determine the eligibility of the AHs/ APs to receive compensation and assistance under proposed Project. Any persons who occupies in the Project area after the cut-off date will not be entitled to compensate and assist. Fixed assets such as built structures (new or expansion of existing structures), crops, fruit trees, and other similar assets established after the cut-off date will not be compensated. The cut-off-date for this Project is the date that EDC announced the Project implementation to the Project communities.
Detailed Measurement Survey (DMS)	:	Refers to a measuring activity to be conducted based on the approved detailed engineering drawings to measure and count all affected properties. This activity involves the finalization and/or validation of the results of the IOL, severity of impacts, and list of AHs earlier done during LARP preparation. The final cost of resettlement will be determined after the DMS and RCS.
Economic Displacement	:	Refers to loss of land, assets, access to assets, income sources, or means of livelihood because of (i) involuntary acquisition of land, or (ii) involuntary restrictions on land use or on access to legally designated parks and protected areas.
Eligibility	:	Refers to any person or persons, household, firm, private or public institution who has settled in the Project area before the cut-off date, that (i) loss of shelter, (ii) loss of assets or ability to access such assets, permanently or

	temporary, or (iii) loss of income sources or mean of livelihood, regardless of relocation will be entitled to be compensation and/or assistance.
Entitlement	: Refers to a range of measures, such as compensation for loss of affected assets and assistance to be provided to the AHs depending on the type and severity of their losses.
Income Restoration	: Refers to re-establishing productive livelihood of the APs to enable income generation equal to or, if possible, better than that earned by the APs before the resettlement or of pre-project levels.
Inventory of Losses (IOL)	: This is the process where all affected trees and sources of income and livelihood inside the ROW are identified, and their replacement costs calculated.
Involuntary Resettlement	: Refers to when displaced persons have no right to refuse land acquisition by the state that result in their displacement which occurs when land is acquired through (i) expropriation by invoking the eminent domain power of the state, or (ii) land is acquired through negotiated settlement when the pricing is negotiated, and the failure will result in expropriation through invoking the eminent domain of power of the state.
Land Acquisition	: Refers to the process whereby an individual, household, firm or private institution is compelled by the government through the Project's Executing Agency to alienate all or part of the land it owns or possesses to the ownership and possession of that agency for public purpose in return for compensation at replacement cost.
Physical Displacement	: Refers to relocation, loss of residential land, or loss of shelter because of (i) involuntary acquisition of land; or (ii) involuntary restrictions on land use or on access to legally designated parks and protected areas.
Relocation	: This is the physical relocation of a displaced people from her/his pre-project place of residence and/or business.
Replacement Cost Study	: This refers to the process involved in determining replacement costs of affected assets and land and performed by an independent qualified consultant (firm or individual) with necessary expertise to carry out asset valuation. The calculation of full replacement cost will be based on the following elements: (i) fair market value; (ii) transaction costs; (iii) interest accrued, (iv) transitional and restoration costs; and (v) other applicable payments, if any. Where market conditions are absent or in a formative stage, the borrower/client will consult with the APs and host populations to obtain adequate information about recent land transactions, land value by types, land titles, land use, cropping patterns and crop production, availability of land in the project area and region, and other related information.
Right of Way (ROW)	: Refers to the area outside 20m of width along the transmission line (equal or greater than 10m on each side from the centerline of transmission line) to determine the impacts on trees. All tall fruit trees and other trees which pose a risk to the transmission line will be cut down. No compensation will be provided for the land within the ROW.
Severely Affected Households	: This refers to AHs who will be (i) physically displaced from housing, or (ii) those losing 10% or more of their total productive assets (income generating).
Updated Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plan (LARP)	: Prepared when detailed designs or land demarcation have been completed and the full impacts following a detailed measurement survey are known. The Updated LARP is an update of LARP which has been prepared based on preliminary design of the Project.

Vulnerable Groups	: These are distinct groups of DPs who are likely to be more adversely affected than others and who are likely to have limited ability to reestablish their livelihoods or improve their status and comprise: (i) all households living below the national poverty rate established by the Government,* (ii) female headed households with dependents living below the national poverty rate, (iii) disabled headed households with no other means of support, (iv) elderly headed households who are landless and with no other means of support, (v) landless poor living below the national poverty rate, and (vi) indigenous people or ethnic minorities (who often have traditional land rights but no formal titles) .

Executive Summary

Project Description

1. The Asian Development Bank (ADB) worked with Electricité du Cambodge (EDC) of Cambodia to develop a National Solar Park Project (the Project). A power of up to 100 megawatts (MW) is to be procured from solar photovoltaic (PV) power plants from the private sector through a competitive tendering process. The objectives of the Project are to (i) demonstrate the ability of a large-scale solar PV to produce solar energy at a competitive price; (ii) enhance technical benefits to the national grid; and (iii) replace the fossil-fuel and hydropower generation in the future. The solar park is planned to be constructed in the border area of Kampong Chhnang and Kampong Speu provinces. The project will also include the construction of a 230 kilovolt (kV) double circuit overhead power transmission line. The length of the transmission line is approximately 40km from the solar park substation to the nearest grid substation – Grid Substation 6 (GS6).

2. Permanent land acquisition is needed for the construction of solar park (the solar plant and associated facilities) and power towers along the transmission line. An area of 100ha of land will be required for the construction of common facilities of the solar park and for the first 60MW solar plant. The process of negotiation with the land owners would be applied to acquire this area. Regarding land acquisition for the construction of power towers along the transmission line, lands are needed on a permanent basis of power towers' foundation. EDC purchases the required land for their full value and thus, in the future, could use, control and access over the land under the towers.

3. An Updated Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plan (LARP) was developed to govern land acquisition and resettlement of Sections 1 and 2 of the 230kV transmission line with a total length of 23.166km. This Updated LARP was approved by ADB in June 2021.

4. However, compensation and assistance payment was already made to 411 affected households (AHs) with 1,954 affected persons (APs) for construction of 55 power towers from February to May, 2021. The payment was carried out before the preparation and approval of the Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2; therefore, a due diligence review is required to determine if the land acquisition, compensation and assistance were carried out in compliance with the ADB's Safeguards Policy Statement (SPS, 2009) and the agreed Updated LARP between EDC and ADB. A corrective action plan (CAP) is required for identified gaps of implemented compensation and assistance for the AHs with those in the agreed Updated LARP.

Scope of land acquisition and resettlement of constructed power towers

5. The Detailed measurement survey (DMS) was carried out from December 2020 to April 2021 by Social, Environment and Public Relations Office (SEPRO) under EDC to determine the affected land and other assets on land of the AHs. For the construction of 55 power towers, a number of 411 households (1,954 APs) was identified as the AHs. A total of 357,548 m² of land was affected by the construction of 55 power towers and the transmission line that includes 12,515 m² of permanently acquired land and 345,033 m² of land with restriction on land use. The area of lands that was permanently required included 11,852 m² of paddy land; 438 m² of residential land; and 225 m² of other annual crops land. A total of 87 households (397 APs) was with land permanently acquired. The area of 345,033 m² of land within the Right of Ways (ROW) of transmission line comprised of 9,660 m² of residential land, 330,208 m² of paddy land, and 5,165 m² of other annual crops land. A number of 398 AHs (1,899 APs) had land within the ROW of the transmission line that is affected by land use restriction.

6. There were 348 households (1,605 APs) with loss of various types of trees. The DMS results indicated that a total of 1,010 of trees was cut down included 170 timber trees

and 828 fruit trees. In addition, the construction of 55 power towers also caused impacts on 174.62 m² of structures of five households (24 APs). Those included 70.84 m² of houses belong to two (02) households (10 APs); 82.08 m² of stalls/shop owned by four (04) households with 19 persons; and 21.7 m² of eave of one household (05 APs). Among five households who had structures affected, one household (05 APs) whose house was fully affected also had their stall fully impacted and one household (05 APs) was with both main house and eave affected. The households, however, had not to relocate as they were living in another main houses and the affected houses were just used for relaxation purpose.

7. Moreover, the business activities of one (01) household (5 APs) were also temporarily disrupted due to the construction of 55 power towers. The stall was fully affected and the owner had to re-construct his stall on the remaining land so the business was disrupted during the time of re-constructing the stall. The shop owner spent 10 days to re-establish his stall and operate the business activities normally. This AH is considered as severely AH by the Project. With other three affected shops, as behind the affected shops are the main structures and the large remaining land area of the shop owners so that the shop owners just moved backward to the main structures and continued the business – and the business was not affected.

8. Among 411 AHs (1,954 APs), 32 AHs (135 APs) were vulnerable households; of which, 12 AHs (42 APs) were female-headed households; and 20 AHs (93 APs) were elderly headed households with no mean of supports. Furthermore, one (01) household (5 APs) was considered as severely AH as the stall was fully demolished and had to be relocated.

Findings of the Due Diligence

9. The DMS was carried out by SEPRO from December 2020 to April 2021 to determine the scope of impacts on land and other assets on land of the AHs. The measurement process was conducted with the participation of AHs, representatives of governor at commune level and the village chiefs. The implementation of the process was informed and agreed with local authorities and AHs before its commencement. The AHs were made aware of scope of impacts on their assets.

10. The AHs participated in public consultation meetings held during compensation and land acquisition implementation for construction of the power towers. During the meetings, the AHs were provided the Project information including (i) detailed engineering design of the transmission line; (ii) scope of impacts based on DMS results; (iii) eligibility and entitlements; (iv) the proposed implementation schedule; and (v) the proposed GRM. In these meetings, the Project Information Booklet (PIB) were distributed to the participants. The AHs were satisfied with the information disclosure of the Project.

11. An independent and qualified consultant was engaged by SEPRO to determine the compensation rates of lands and other assets on land. The affected lands were compensated at full replacement cost while compensation for affected trees was calculated by market rates. The affected structures were compensated at full replacement cost without depreciation and deduction for salvageable materials. The loss of business income was taken into account during the DMS; however, compensation for the impacts on business has not been made. Apart from compensation for lands and other assets on land, the transportation allowance for house and personal goods were paid for three (03) AHs out of five (05) AHs whose houses and stall affected. Those included one AH with stall affected, one AH with house affected and the other AH with house and stall affected. In addition, the living allowance during transition period has not been paid for the eligible household and the vulnerable households were not fully provided the special allowance that is specified in Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2.

12. The compensation payment for impacts of construction of 55 power towers was conducted from February to May 2021. All of the 411 affected households (1,954 APs) received their compensation payment. The schedule of compensation payment was

informed to the AHs by local authorities and village chiefs and the payment was implemented at the commune's office. Total amount of compensation and assistance provided to the AHs was \$758,815. Those included the compensation for affected land, structure and trees; the transportation allowance and special allowance for vulnerable households.

13. The DMS results indicated that a total of 33 households – 140 persons were eligible to be provided the income restoration allowance including 32 vulnerable AHs (135 APs) and one severely AH (05 APs). It was agreed with the eligible households that the cash assistance would be provided to the households to implement the registered livelihood rehabilitation measures. However, this allowance has not yet been provided to 33 eligible households.

14. After receiving the compensation payment, the AHs handed over their lands to EDC for the civil works. The construction works were commenced in June 2021 after the completion of the compensation payment.

15. At the time of preparing the due diligence, although the living allowance has not been provided to the AHs and the special allowance and the transportation support have not yet fully made, no related complaints or grievances of the AHs are logged by the affected households. In case there is any complaints or concerns of the AHs, those would be addressed following the project GRM.

16. A corrective action plan (CAP) has been prepared by EDC to ensure the compliance with the requirements of ADB's SPS (2009) and the Project policies specified in the Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2. The calculated amount for the CAP implementation is \$13,178 and this budget will be disbursed by EDC for CAP implementation. The CAP will be implemented in August 2021.

I. Introduction

1. Project Description

1. ADB worked with EDC to develop a National Solar Park Project (the Project) where power of up to 100 MW is procured from solar photovoltaic (PV) power plants of the private sector through a competitive tendering process. The Project aims to (i) demonstrate the ability of a large-scale solar PV to produce solar energy at a competitive price; (ii) provide technical benefits to the national grid; and (iii) replace the fossil-fuel and hydropower generation in the future. The expansion of solar energy production will help diversify the power generation mix and complement the existing base of hydropower plants to meet daytime peak demand and dry season shortages, as well as increase the percentage of clean energy supply, in line with the Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) stated greenhouse gas emissions reduction targets.
2. The Project has two outputs as below:
 - **Output 1:** The solar park and transmission interconnection constructed. A 100MW solar power park will be constructed in Kampong Chhnang province and a transmission interconnection system to GS6 near Phnom Penh – the capital of Cambodia to supply power to the national grid. The solar park will initially include 100ha of land; associated construction works; common facilities; and supporting infrastructure to accommodate 60MW of solar PV plant capacity. The transmission interconnection infrastructure comprises (i) the 100 MW capacity pooling substation at the solar park; (ii) a supervisory control and data acquisition system compatible with EDC's requirements, advanced forecasting tools, and expanded information and communication technology applications; (iii) the 230kV double circuit overhead transmission line between the solar park substation and GS6; and (iv) two new bays with switchgear at GS6.
 - **Output 2:** Capacity strengthening of EDC in solar power plant construction and operation, Project design, grid integration and competitive procurement. The Project will strengthen EDC's capacity to design, construct and operate solar PV plants and solar parks. EDC's capacity will also be enhanced to procure competitively bid independent solar PV plants, and to adopt energy storage systems and other measures to integrate intermittent renewable energy into national grid.
3. The Project includes two components:
 - **The solar park:** this will be constructed in the border area of Kampong Chhnang and Kampong Speu provinces, near the Phnom Penh demand center;
 - **The transmission line:** An approximately 40km of 230kV double circuit overhead power transmission line is planned to construct. Start point of the transmission line is the solar park substation and the end point is GS6 in Kampong Speu province.
4. Land will be acquired only for Output 1 for the construction of solar park and the 40km 230kV double circuit transmission line. A total of 100 ha of land will be acquired permanently for construction of common facilities of the solar park and for the first 60MW of solar plant capacity in the park. This area will be acquired using a negotiated resettlement. For the construction of transmission line, land will be required for a permanent basis of power towers along the transmission line. The EDC will purchase the required land plots for their full value and thus, in the future, have full land use control and access over the land under the towers. An Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2 of the transmission line with a total length of 23.166km was prepared and approved by ADB in June 2021.
5. Among 68 power towers that are planned to be constructed under Sections 1 and 2 of the transmission line, the construction of 55 towers were commenced in June 2021 and completed in July 2021. The constructed power towers were distributed in six communes

under Sections 1 and 2 of transmission line. The number of constructed towers in each commune is presented in following table.

2. The Due Diligence

6. Compensation payment was made to 411 households (1,954 persons) who were affected by the construction of 55 power towers under Sections 1 and 2 from February to May 2021 before the Updated LARP was prepared and approved for the Sections. A due diligence review; therefore, is required to identify if any gaps of actual land acquisition, compensation and assistance to the affected households with the provisions of the agreed Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2; and if the gaps are identified, proposed corrective actions for the gaps to ensure that all the AHs are provided with the entitlements in accordance to the provisions of the agreed Updated LARP.

7. To prepare the DDR, documents related to land acquisition, compensation and recorded by SEPRO under EDC and payment vouchers of the AHs were collected and reviewed for the data and information on the number of AHs, type of impacts, applied compensation unit rates and types of assistance provided to the AHs, information disclosure and public consultation carried out as well as the information concerning redressing of complaints and/or grievances raised by the AHs (if any).

8. The conducted compensation and resettlement activities for the constructed 55 power towers are shown below Table 2.

II. Scope of Land Acquisition and Resettlement

9. SEPRO under EDC carried out the DMS from December 2020 to April 2021 to identify the affected land and non-land assets of the AHs. Based on Technical Guidelines of EDC, a Corridor of Impacts (COI) of 20m was applied (10m on each side from a central tower/pole) to determine the impacts on land and other assets on land of AHs. Lands within the ROW of transmission line (20m of width along the transmission line - equal or greater than 10m on each side from the centerline of transmission line) were not permanently required but would be restricted on land use. A limitation at 3m of height was applied to all structures/ buildings and trees within the ROW. Furthermore, an area of 225m² of land (15 x 15m) was acquired for the construction of each tower.

10. A number of 411 households with 1,954 persons were affected by the construction of 55 power towers. Among those, 13 households (55 persons) were affected by construction of power towers; 324 households (1,557 persons) were with land within the ROW of the transmission line and would be restricted on land use; and 74 households (342 persons) were with impacts by both components (power towers and transmission line).

11. A total of 12,515 m² of land was permanently required for the construction of the power towers' foundation. This area included 438 m² of residential land; 11,852 m² of paddy land and 225 m² of other annual crops land. Total number of households with land permanently acquired was 87 (397 APs), of which two households (13 persons) were with residential land affected; 84 households (379 persons) had paddy land recovered; and one household (05 APs) was with other annual crops land acquired.

12. Regarding the area of land within the ROW, an area of 345,033 m² of lands was not permanently required but is being restricted on land use. The area of restricted lands comprises 9,660 m² of residential land owned by 11 households (56 persons); 330,208 m² of paddy land of 385 households (1,830 persons); and 5,165 m² of other annual crops land owned by two (02) households (13 persons). A total of 398 AHs (1,899 APs) was with lands within the ROW of the transmission line that is affected by land use restriction.

13. A number of 348 households (1,605 persons) was with loss of trees due to the construction of 55 power towers and the transmission line. The DMS results showed that a total of 1,010 of trees was cut off including 170 timber trees; and 828 fruit trees. Most of affected trees (741 out of 1,010 affected trees) were the big trees; 79 trees were at medium size; and 190 trees were small trees.

14. According to the DMS results, an area of 174.62 m² of structures of five households (24 APs) was affected by the Project, including 70.84 m² of main houses of two (02) households (10 persons); 82.08 m² of stalls/shops owned by four (04) households (19 persons); and 21.7 m² of eaves of one household (05 persons). It is noted that one household (05 persons) was with both stall and main house fully affected and one household (05 persons) whose main house was fully affected was with the eave affected.

15. The affected houses were the same Category (2A) with simple construction material: metal fibrocement roof; wooden walls; and wooden poles. The main houses were fully affected, however, the owners had not to relocate as they were living in other main houses and the affected houses were being used for relaxation purpose.

16. As mentioned above, four (04) households (19 persons) were with 04 stalls/shops fully affected by the land acquisition for the construction of the power towers. Among those, two (02) AHs were operating two grocery stalls, one (01) AH was operating a motorcycle repair shop and one (01) AH was selling mobile phone accessories. All four (04) AHs were running their own business without hiring labors or employees. It is noted that only one household (5 APs) lost their business income as the grocery stall was fully demolished and had to relocate. The owner re-constructed his stall on the remaining land plot. The business activity was disrupted temporarily and it took ten days to re-establish the business normally.

The daily net-income from business of this AH was determined at \$30 based on the results of RCS and consultation with the AH. For other three affected stall/shops, the affected area of each structure was less than 20 m² and the areas behind the stall/shops were the main structures of the owners. The AHs just moved their business activities to their main houses; therefore, their businesses were not disrupted.

17. Among 411 AHs (1,954 persons), 32 households (135 APs) were considered as vulnerable AHs including 12 AHs (42 persons) female – headed households with dependents and 20 other AHs (93 persons) elderly headed households with no other means of supports. No household lost 10% or more of total productive landholding; however, one (01) AH (5 APs) had a stall fully affected due to the construction of power towers' foundation. As the stall was relocated and the business income was temporarily disrupted, this household was counted as severely AH.

18. The impacts of the construction of 55 power towers is summarized in following table.

III. The Entitlements for the Affected Households

19. An update of LARP was prepared to govern land acquisition and resettlement of the 230kV transmission line - Sections 1 and 2. The entitlements for the households affected by the construction of power towers and transmission line under Sections 1 and 2 are given in Appendix 3.

IV. Findings of the Due Diligence

1. Detailed Measurement Surveys

20. To identify the scope of impacts on lands and other assets on land, the DMS was carried out by SEPRO on the following dates:

- Section 1: 04th – 21st December, 2020;
- Section 2: 21st December 2020 – 16th April 2021.

21. The DMS was conducted with the participation of AHs, representatives of governor at commune level, village chiefs and SEPRO under EDC. The detailed measurement was carried out based on the detailed engineering design of power towers (10m on each side from a central tower/pole) and the ROW of the transmission line (20m of width along the transmission line- equal or greater than 10m on each side from the centerline of transmission line). Land within the ROW was not permanently required but is being restricted on land use. The structure and building within the ROW will be limited at 3m of height; and any fruit trees and other tall trees planted within the ROW which exceed 3m in height would be cut off. An area of 225m² of land (15 x 15m) was also acquired for the construction of each tower for 55 power towers.

22. Apart from the impacts on land and other assets on land, the impacts on business activities of local households were also taken into account. The impacts on business of four households (small business) were identified during the DMS.

23. Before the commencement of DMS, the implementation schedule was informed and agreed with local authorities and AHs; therefore, the AHs could participate in the DMS. The AHs were aware of the scope of impacts on their land and other assets on land. Any opinions or concerns of AHs on the results of DMS were resolved during the DMS implementation. The DMS results were posted in commune offices for dissemination.

2. Public Consultation, Information Disclosure and Participation

24. Six public consultation meetings at commune level were held in December 2020 and March 2021 in Khsem Khsan, Trach Tong, Chan Saen, Maen Chey, Rung Roeng and Monourom communes. There were 88 APs and village chiefs including 66 men and 22 women attended the meetings. During the public meetings, the AHs were provided information of the Project including (i) the detailed engineering design of the transmission line; (ii) the scope of land acquisition based on the DMS results; (iii) the principles of land acquisition, compensation, assistance and resettlement (such as cut-off date, eligibility, proposed entitlements, etc.); (iv) the proposed implementation schedule of land acquisition, compensation and assistance and civil works; and (v) the proposed GRM. The AHs were satisfied with the information provided by the Project.

25. The public meetings were continuously held during the compensation and assistance payment. In these meetings, the procedures of payment process and the schedule of payment were discussed and agreed with local authorities and the AHs. The information of the Project was disseminated sufficiently as per requirements of agreed Updated LARP;

26. Regarding information disclosure, the PIB was prepared to explain in details and was also delivered to the participants in the public consultation meetings. Results of DMS were also posted at commune's office for disclosure.

3. Entitlement

27. The RCS was carried out in January 2021 by the Bluefield Co.Ltd – the independent and qualified consultant engaged by SEPRO. The RCS was conducted to determine the compensation unit rates for affected lands and other assets on land (structures, crops and trees).

28. For the permanently required lands (residential and agricultural lands), the affected lands were compensated at full replacement cost including taxes and transaction cost. The land certificate and other legal documents were adjusted at no cost for the affected land owners. With the lands within the ROW, the AHs were provided cash assistance equivalent to 30% of the value of the affected land area. The AHs whose land is located within the COI are still using their affected land with restriction on land use.

29. Regarding affected structures, the compensation was made at full replacement cost of structure with no depreciation and no deduction for salvageable materials. The AHs were allowed to use salvageable materials from the built construction at no cost.

30. For the affected trees, the compensation was made by net annual income loss for one year at market rate. All fruit trees and other tall trees which exceed 3m in height were cut off and compensated at market rate based on the year of the trees. The AHs with trees affected were informed the land acquisition more than one month in advance. In addition, the AHs were allowed to harvest their crops (paddy and corn) from 04th December 2020 to 16th April 2021; therefore, no compensation for crops was required.

31. Among 411 households who received the compensation payment for the construction of 55 power towers, one (01) household (5 APs) was with loss of business. This AH operated a grocery/palm juice stall. The business activity was disrupted due to land acquisition and it took 10 days to re-establish as pre-Project condition. However, the compensation for affected business of this AH as envisaged in the Updated LARP, has not been made to the household.

32. Apart from compensation for affected lands and other assets on land, the AHs are entitled to receive assistances as specified in approved Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2, including:

- Income restoration allowance: provides to AHs who have to relocate (including physical and economic displacements) and vulnerable households: one-time cash assistance of \$200/household;
- Living allowance during transition period: provides to AHs who have to relocate (physical and economic displacements): one-time cash assistance of \$200/household;
- Transportation allowance for houses and personal goods: provides to AHs who have houses and stall/shops affected and have to relocate:
 - Households who will shift back their houses in the same land plot: \$80 per household;
 - Households who will shift back their stalls in the same land plot: \$40 per household;
- Special allowance provides to all vulnerable households (one-time assistance of \$300/household);

33. However, the above assistances were not fully made to the AHs. The compensation and assistance payment status compared with provisions of the agreed Updated LARP is presented in Table 4 below:

4. Compensation Payment

34. The compensation payment for the impacts of construction of 55 power towers was conducted from 16th February 2021 to 28th May 2021 before the approval of the Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2. A total of 411 households (1,954 persons) received their compensation and assistance payment. The schedule of compensation payment was informed to AHs by local authorities and village chiefs and the payment was carried out at the office of Communes. The time of compensation payment for AHs affected by each power towers is attached in Appendix 2.

35. The total amount of the compensation and assistance that was made to 411 AHs was \$758,815 including compensation for lands and other assets on land; transportation allowance for house and personal goods; and the special allowance for vulnerable households. The details of compensation and assistance amount are shown in Table 5 below.

5. Income Restoration Program

36. According to the entitlements specified in Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2, the severely AH and vulnerable AHs are entitled to participate the Livelihood restoration program (LRP) prepared by the Project. The eligible households are to be provided with cash assistance to (i) expand or develop their business (shops, restaurants, etc.) after the land acquisition of the Project; (ii) training on business management and development; and (iii) invest on occupational trainings to get non-agricultural occupation. The LRP participating households have officially registered the LRP activities and confirmed implementing the activities. It has been agreed with the LRP participating households that cash assistance would be provided to the households to carry out the registered livelihood rehabilitation measures (\$200 per an eligible household). Among 411 households received compensation payment in first-half of 2021, 32 households (135 APs) were vulnerable AHs and one (01) household (5 APs) was severely AH. Therefore, total number of eligible households of providing income restoration allowance is 33 AHs (140 APs). However, as mentioned above, the income restoration allowance has not yet been made to the eligible households.

6. Land Acquisition

37. The compensation payment was carried out from 16th February to 28th May 2021. After receiving the compensation and assistance payment, the AHs handed over the affected land to the Project. The civil works were commenced in June 2021 when the sites were available.

7. Grievances

38. The Grievance Redress Mechanism was discussed and disseminated to AHs during the public consultation meetings. The AHs were aware of mechanism to raise their complaints/ grievances (if any). The GRM was also included in the PIB which was prepared and distributed to the participants in the public meetings. At the time of conducting the DDR, although the special allowance for the vulnerable households and transportation allowance were not fully provided, and the living allowance and livelihood restoration assistance have not yet been provided to the AHs, no related complaints and grievances has been lodged by the AHs at all levels.

39. Table 6 below summarizes the findings of the DDR and degree of compliance to the provisions of the agreed Updated LARP for Sections 1 and 2.

VII. Budget for the Corrective Action Plan

41. EDC is responsible for the preparation of budget for compensation and assistance of the Project. SEPRO under EDC will implement process of disbursement and carry out payment of proposed CAP. The budget required for the implementation of CAP is \$13,178. This budget includes compensation for loss of income; living allowance during transition period; transportation allowance for houses and personal goods; additional special allowance for vulnerable households; income restoration allowance; and contingency cost.
