Guy BoileauCounsellor and Senior Trade Commissioner
Embassy of Canada in Manila

Mr. Boileau currently holds the position of Counsellor and Senior Trade Commissioner at the Canadian Embassy to the Philippines. He leads a dynamic team of dedicated Trade Commissioners focused on strengthening bilateral commercial ties in key priority sectors for Canada, including clean-technologies and climate finance, infrastructure, mining,

aerospace, agri-food, as well as with the Asian Development Bank. Prior to arriving to the Philippines in September 2021, Mr. Boileau was Senior Advisor to the Deputy Minister of International Trade.

From 2015-2019, he was the trade policy Counsellor at the Canadian Embassy to Mexico. During his tenure, Mr. Boileau was an integral member of Canada's negotiating team responsible for the renegotiation of the NAFTA. He also led a team of Trade Commissioners dedicated to supporting Canadian stakeholder efforts in key sectors of Canadian interest. Mr. Boileau was also Canada's Deputy Chief Negotiator for some of Canada's free trade agreement (FTA) negotiations, including the now implemented Canada-Panama FTA. Between 2009-2012, Mr. Boileau was the First Secretary at the Canadian Embassy in Indonesia, dedicated to advancing Canada's strategic relations with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).

Mr. Boileau has a Bachelor's degree in International Relations from Glendon College, the bilingual campus of York University (Toronto, Canada) and obtained a Master's degree from the Norman Paterson School of International Affairs at Carleton University (Ottawa, Canada). He speaks English, French and Spanish.

Mr. Rupert Cao joined the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development in 2009. He is the First Secretary for Trade and Investment at the Embassy of Canada to Indonesia. He manages a team of Trade Commissioners covering Infrastructure, ICT, Aerospace, Clean-tech and Education. He recently completed an assignment as Deputy Director for Trade and Investment at the Canadian Trade Office in Taipei where he led a team covering ICT, S&T and Innovation. In 2018, he led the establishment

of the Canadian Technology Accelerator in Taipei to help innovative Canadian SMEs expand to the Taiwan market.

Peter MacArthur graduated from McGill University in Montreal and studied at l'IGnstitut d'etudes politiques in Paris before joining the Department of External Affairs in 1982, initially as a member of Canada's Trade Commissioner Service.

Asia-Pacific assignments began as trade commissioner in Moscow focused on the then USSR and Mongolia prior to postings to New Delhi

and Mumbai as Consul in India. He was seconded to Australia's Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade in Canberra where he worked in the OECD-G7 Section and the East Asia Analytical Unit. He also served as Trade Commissioner in Hong Kong 1994-97 and as Minister (Commercial) and Senior Trade Commissioner in Tokyo 2004-09 overseeing commercial-economic relations with Japan. He was Canada's Senior Official at APEC from 2015-18 and most recently served as Ambassador to Indonesia and Timor-Leste from 2016-19.











At headquarters in Ottawa, he was Deputy Director, Economic Relations with Russia; Deputy Director, Policy and Strategic Planning; Director, Canadian Trade Commissioner Service Overseas Operations; and Director, China and Mongolia. He also served as Director General, Global Business Opportunities focused on industry sectors and science and technology, and in 2012 became Director General of the South, Southeast Asia and Oceania Bureau in Global Affairs Canada.

On February 7, 2020 Canada's Foreign Minister, the Honourable Francois-Philippe Champagne, announced Peter MacArthur's appointment as Ambassador-designate to the Republic of Philippines. He presented his credentials to the President of the Republic of the Philippines, His Excellency, Rodrigo Roa Duterte, on June 19, 2020. He is married with two children.

Radha Krishna "Kris" Panday was appointed to the Board of Directors of the Asian Development Bank in April 2018. In this capacity, he represents Canada, Denmark, Finland, Ireland, The Netherlands, Norway and Sweden, with responsibility for the direction of the general operations of the Bank, including: (i) approving policies, loans, guarantees, investments and technical assistance, (ii) approving borrowings, and (iii) approving budgets. Kris has served as Chair of both the Audit and Risk Committee

and the Compliance Review Committee and Member, Ethics Committee, and previously served on the Human Resources Committee. He currently serves as the Dean of the Board of Directors.

Other overseas assignments have included Dubai, as Canada's first Consul General, Washington DC, as Minister Counsellor (Congressional Relations), Seoul, as Counsellor (Market Access); and Singapore, as Trade Commissioner. Headquarters assignments with Global Affairs Canada have included roles as Director, Softwood Lumber Division, and Executive Assistant to the Deputy Minister of International Trade.
